COVID-19 Situation Overview (till 03 June 2021)

Bangladesh



- ⇒ **804,293** cases confirmed
- ⇒ **12,694** deaths from COVID-19
- ⇒ **744,065** patients recovered from the diseases

Global

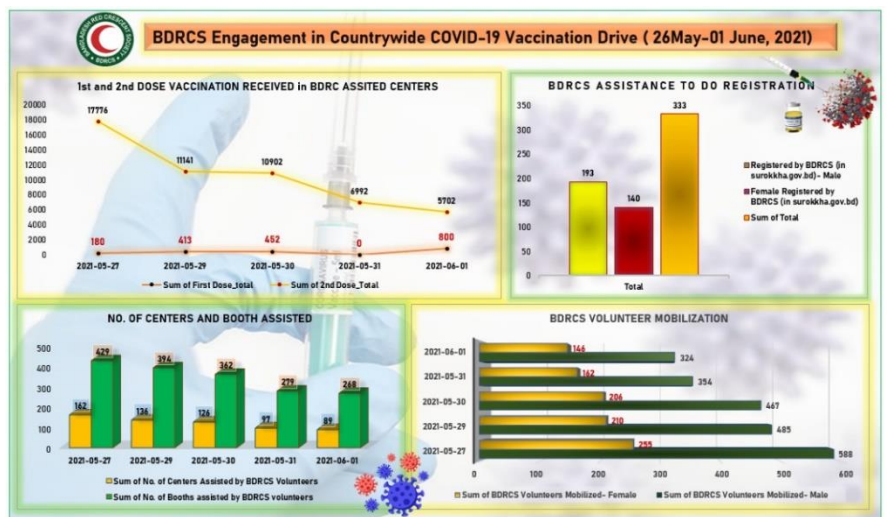


- ⇒ **172,453,743** cases confirmed
- ⇒ **3,707,594** deaths from COVID-19
- ⇒ **155,106,568** patients recovered from the diseases

Currently, Bangladesh is experiencing the second wave of COVID-19 which started from March 2021. At the beginning of the second wave, the rate of daily infection stands higher than that of first wave. To suppress the spread of COVID-19, the government enforced lockdowns across the country. However, the country reported steep decline in new daily COVID-19 cases over the couple of weeks due to government initiatives.

BDRCS COVID-19 Response

- ⇒ **A total of 51,468 cooked food** were provided to the poor people affected by the prolonged lockdown. Among them, 2400 packets have been distributed by the National Headquarters (NHQ) this week.
- ⇒ With the support from Australian Government/ Australian Red Cross, BDRCS together with the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC) is planning to procure **640 oxygen cylinders** including **200 oxygen concentrators**.
- ⇒ **660 Red Crescent Youth volunteers** engaged/day on an average in government vaccination campaign. A glimpse of BDRCS support to government's vaccination campaign is presented in the charts.
- ⇒ Up until the date, **230 COVID-19 positive patients admitted** to the Holy Family Red Crescent Medical College and Hospital (HFRMCH) and 228 patients have already been released from the hospital.



- ⇒ A total of **201 people received psychosocial support services** through the Psychosocial Support (PSS) call center. Among them, 15 people received this service during this week.
- ⇒ **96 patients received treatment** (including 20 positive cases) from Integrated Isolation and Treatment Center (IITC) under Population Movement Operation (PMO) in Cox's Bazar.
- ⇒ **137 households** reached with key health awareness messages through outreach activities of the PMO in Cox's Bazar during this reporting period.
- ⇒ **1262 sets of female hygiene kits, 130090 pcs of bath soaps and 65045 pcs of laundry soaps** distributed to Forcibly Displaced Myanmar Nations (FDMN) under Myanmar Refugee Relief Operation (MRRO) in Cox's Bazar during this reporting period.
- ⇒ **The Coca-Cola Foundation** is providing **500,000 USD** to the Bangladesh Red Crescent Society to support COVID-19 response operation especial focus on vaccination campaign, providing personal protective equipment (PPE) to the health workers and volunteers as well as raising mass awareness on COVID-19. More than 2 million are expected to receive direct and indirect benefits from this project.
- ⇒ Australian Government provides **AU\$ 5 million** to the Bangladesh Red Crescent Society to support Bangladesh's COVID-19 preparedness and response. BDRCS together with IFRC will utilise the fund to procure and distribute essential supplies to protect the people from COVID-19 and its impact.



Response from the Government of Bangladesh

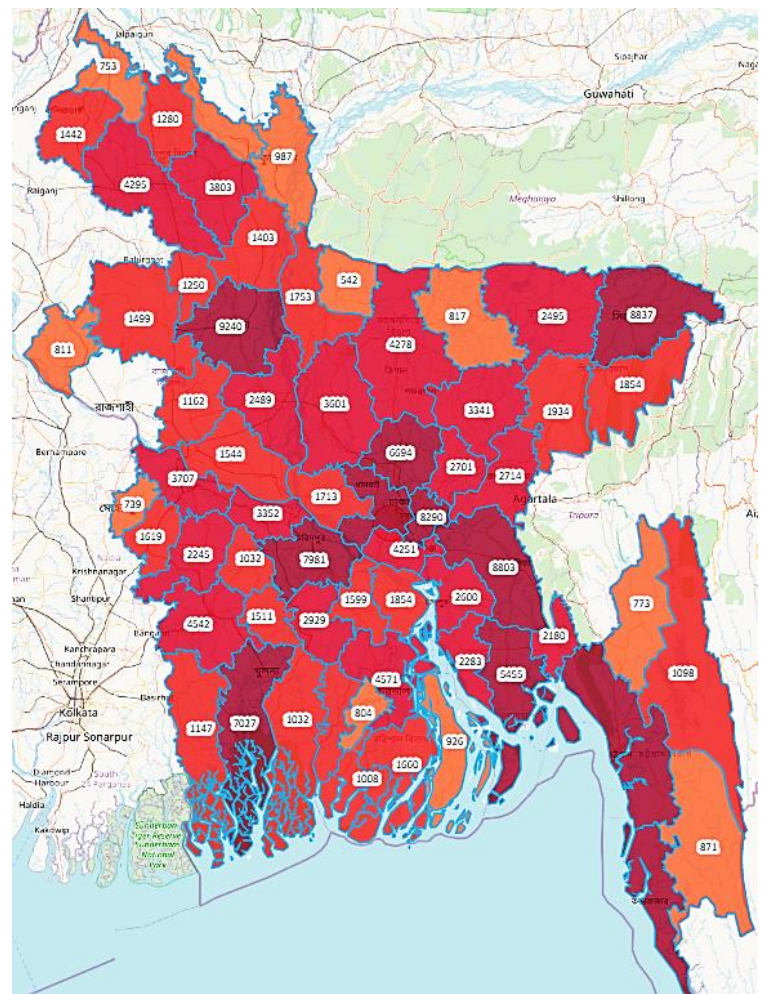
- ⇒ The Cabinet Division extended the countrywide restrictions on movement for another week till June 06 to contain the spread of COVID-19.
- ⇒ 106,000 doses of the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine arrived on June 01 under the global vaccine-sharing initiative COVAX.
- ⇒ According to Bangladesh Education Ministry, the educational institutions would remain closed until June 12 to contain the spread of COVID-19.
- ⇒ The government extended the suspension of passenger movement through land borders with neighboring India for eight more days until May 31 amid surging COVID-19 infection.
