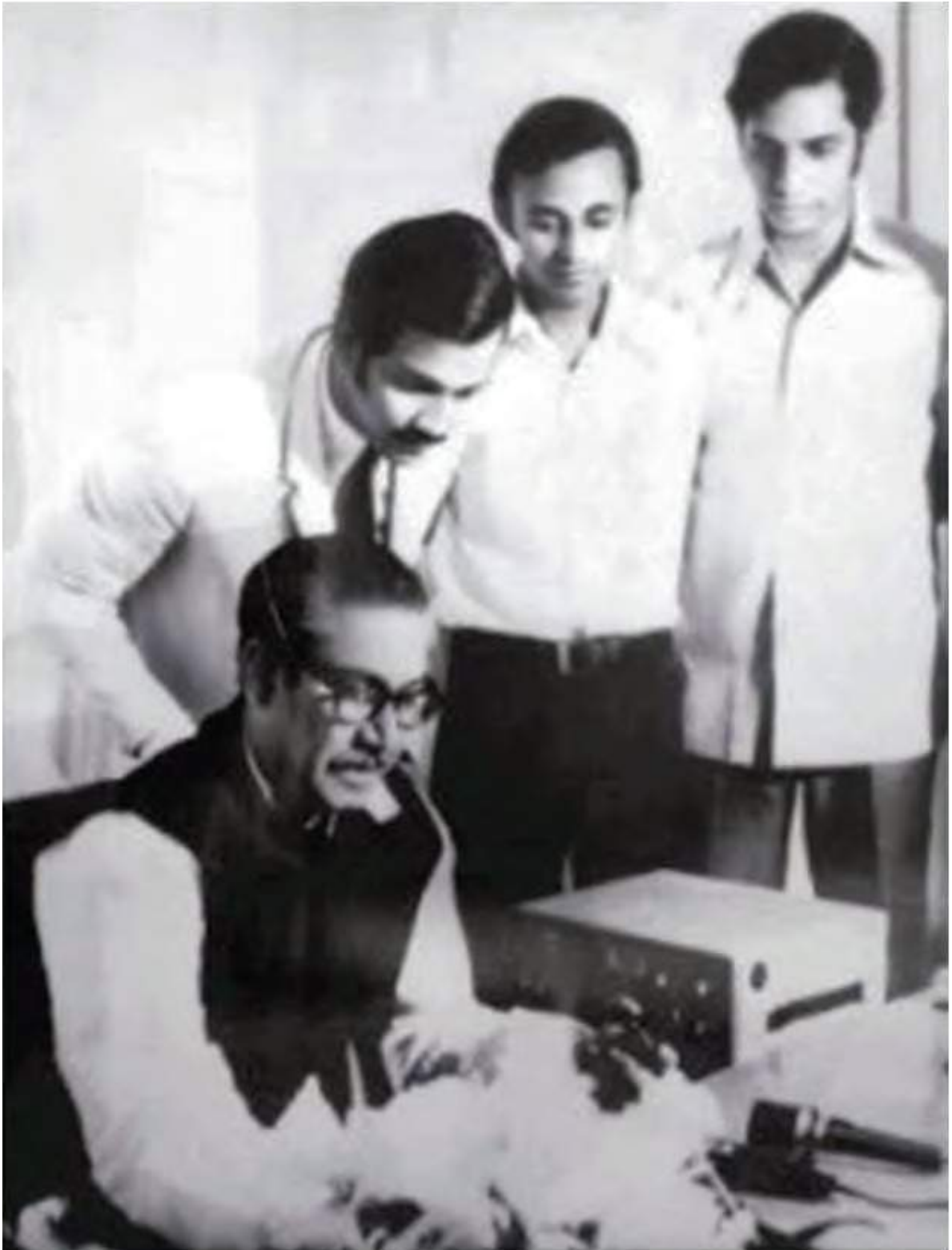

Message

I am delighted to know that the 49th Annual General Meeting of the Bangladesh Red Crescent Society is going to take place in due course. I would like to express my sincere thanks, gratitude and good wishes to all concerned of the Bangladesh Red Crescent Society on this occasion.

Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, the Greatest Bengali of All Time and the Father of the Nation, established the Cyclone Preparedness Program (CPP) in 1973 to mitigate disaster risk in Bangladesh. To safeguard people's lives and property from the cyclone and to provide shelter for cattle, the Father of the Nation, Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib, built 172 shelters known as "Mujib Killa" or "Mujib Fort."

In 1997, we formulated Standing Orders on Disasters to integrate and expedite the disaster management programs. It was revised and updated in 2010. We have formulated a Cyclone Shelter Construction, Maintenance, and Management Policy 2011. In 1997, the Awami League government took the initiative to enact and ratify the Disaster Management Act. After assuming power in 2009, we have ratified and enacted the Disaster Management Act, 2012. In 2012, we established a separate ministry known as the Ministry of Disaster Management and Relief, and also created the Directorate of Disaster Management. We have already adopted the "Bangladesh Delta Plan-2100".

The present Awami League Government has prioritized the use of information technology in pre, during, and post disaster management related activities such as disseminating warning messages, relocating and evacuating people to safe shelter, raising public awareness, disaster risk reduction and preparedness, prompt response, conducting damage assessments, and undertaking activities for rehabilitation and reconstruction, etc. Disaster forecasts and early warning messages are now being transmitted through community radio and mobile phones. We have renovated the old 'Mujib Killas' and newly built 378 more 'Mujib Killas'. During our tenure, 230 flood evacuation shelters and 320 cyclone shelters have been constructed across the country. Another 220 cyclone shelters and 423 flood shelters are under construction. The construction work is underway for 66 warehouses for relief items and disaster management information centers in 64 districts. In addition, necessary search and rescue equipment has been procured to respond to earthquakes. As a result of various timely measures taken by this government, the adverse impact of natural disasters has been greatly mitigated. We have initiated the process of establishing the National Emergency Operation Center (NEOC) for responding to and managing various hazards and disasters.

We have taken all the initiatives to protect the lives and livelihoods of the people through various disaster management activities, including early warning and emergency response. The use of technology in disaster risk reduction and disaster management has also contributed to reducing the loss of lives and assets. In order to make people more sensitized and aware, all relevant stakeholders, including the Red Crescent Society, will have to play an active role.

I am urging the Bangladesh Red Crescent Society to further strengthen the organizational and financial capacity of the society as well as accelerate the implementation of various humanitarian and disaster risk reduction programs in the regional and international arena.

I wish the 49th Annual General Meeting of the Bangladesh Red Crescent Society a great success.

Introduction

The Annual Report 2021 has been prepared based on the accomplished activities of BDRCS 17 departments, 68 branches and its institutions, and it is aligned with BDRCS SP 2021-2025 three goals and specific objectives. Basically, this annual report is a significant document that summarizes the Society's operation all activities for the year 2021.

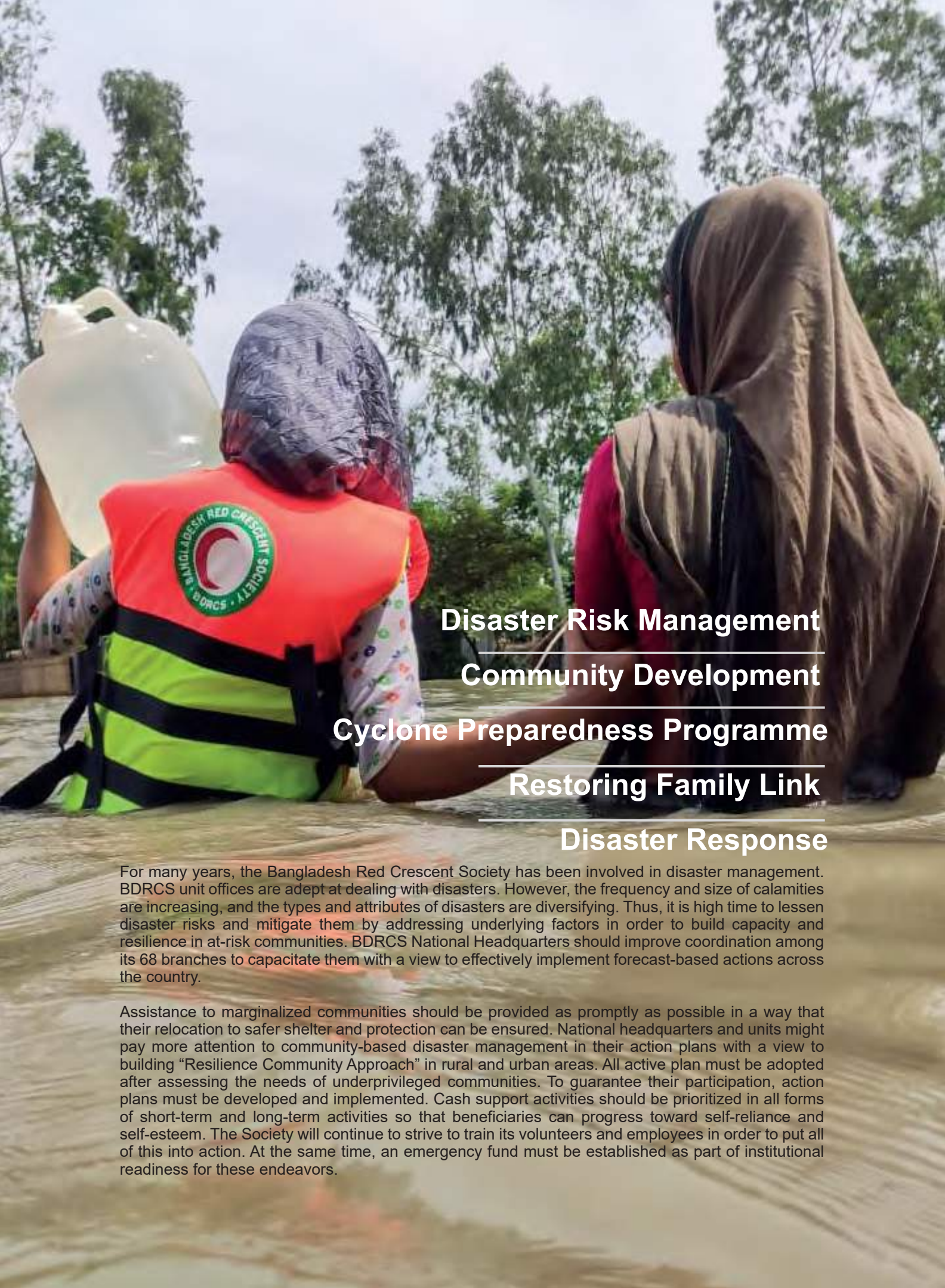
Bangladesh is one of the world's most climate-vulnerable and disaster-prone countries. Cyclones, droughts, tsunamis, tornadoes, earthquakes, river erosion, water logging, rising water levels in rivers and soil salinity all are common occurrence in the country. The Bangladesh government has identified all of them as natural hazards. Aside from these factors, earthquake susceptibility is increasing in both urban and rural areas as a result of unplanned urbanization, migration, population density and unsafe building construction. On the contrary, fires, road accidents, and launch capsizes occur often. Natural and man-made disasters and their consequences are increasing the number of deaths, depleting resources, and turning people's lives and livelihoods upside down.

To deal with the recurring disasters, the Bangladesh Red Crescent Society (BDRCS) has been working with the Bangladesh government for a long time by providing emergency relief and rehabilitation assistance.

Apart from the emergency rehabilitation program, the BDRCS is working relentlessly to improve disaster preparedness and disaster risk reduction, with the goal of minimizing long-term vulnerability in accordance with the Red Cross Red Crescent seven fundamental principles.

This report highlighted the activities undertaken to provide humanitarian assistance to those afflicted by the global COVID-19 pandemic, particularly the involvement of Red Crescent Youth (RCY) volunteers in the government's COVID-19 vaccination campaign. Apart from this, the report covers the activities of the Population Movement Operation (PMO) and the Myanmar Refugee and Relief Operation (MRRO) in Cox's Bazar for forcibly displaced people from Myanmar.

Finally, this report will provide a clear idea about BDRCS activities which was implemented based on operational plan 2021 as well as gives an impression of BDRCS achievement in 2021. This resourceful information will help to increase the Society's image.

Disaster Response

For many years, the Bangladesh Red Crescent Society has been involved in disaster management. BDRCS unit offices are adept at dealing with disasters. However, the frequency and size of calamities are increasing, and the types and attributes of disasters are diversifying. Thus, it is high time to lessen disaster risks and mitigate them by addressing underlying factors in order to build capacity and resilience in at-risk communities. BDRCS National Headquarters should improve coordination among its 68 branches to capacitate them with a view to effectively implement forecast-based actions across the country.

Assistance to marginalized communities should be provided as promptly as possible in a way that their relocation to safer shelter and protection can be ensured. National headquarters and units might pay more attention to community-based disaster management in their action plans with a view to building “Resilience Community Approach” in rural and urban areas. All active plan must be adopted after assessing the needs of underprivileged communities. To guarantee their participation, action plans must be developed and implemented. Cash support activities should be prioritized in all forms of short-term and long-term activities so that beneficiaries can progress toward self-reliance and self-esteem. The Society will continue to strive to train its volunteers and employees in order to put all of this into action. At the same time, an emergency fund must be established as part of institutional readiness for these endeavors.

Disaster Risk Management Department

The Disaster Risk Management Department identifies disaster and climate change risks in many areas of the country and aims to develop essential community-based readiness and capacity building through the implementation of appropriate projects/programs and interventions. By implementing the following projects/programs, the department has reached key milestones in lowering hazard risks and vulnerabilities in 2021:

Coastal Disaster Risk Reduction Program

The major working areas of the program are outlined below:

- To develop disaster ready communities through undertaking necessary initiatives related to disaster risk reduction and implementation of programs.
- Implementing forecast-based actions to mitigate the potential damage to vulnerable community in accordance with the Early Action Protocol before a cyclone strikes at the communities.
- Increase the capacity of community, as well as local and national stakeholders to prepare, respond and coordinate the necessary services.
- Enhancing the climate change adaptation capacity of community people living in areas exposed to potential risks and threats.
- Capacity building and enhancement of activities being carried out by the Cyclone Preparedness Program (CPP).
- Strengthen organizational development initiatives of Bangladesh Red Crescent Society as well as enhancing the disaster response system in the coastal districts.

Significant Achievements of Coastal Disaster Risk Reduction Program in 2021

- 1565 women were imparted 9 days training on vegetable farming, poultry and cattle rearing and fish farming in their homestead courtyards. At the end of the training, each of them received BDT 4500/- totaling BDT 7,042,500/- provided for investing in relevant income generating activities.
- 600 CDRT volunteers were trained on first aid, disaster management, and leadership development while 515 CDMC members were trained on leadership development in disaster management.
- Provide orientation to local administration, local government, and media personnel on the Standing Order on Disaster - 2019.
- Construction of community meeting centers has been completed in five communities. As a result, community meeting centers will be used for disaster management and all other social activities of the people concerned.
- Twelve Trainings were organized on Community Engagement and Accountability (CEA) and Feedback and Complaint Response Mechanism (FCRM). A total of 500 Community Volunteers and 24 Community Organizers were briefed about their roles and responsibilities.
- 50 community organizers are provided with the necessary skills development training which enabled them to successfully playing a leading role in providing insights into disaster management, climate change and the Red Cross Red Crescent to members of small community groups under the Coastal DRR program.
- 25000+ people have been provided with basic insights into disaster management, climate change, COVID-19, and the Red Cross Red Crescent through various small groups in the community being supported by the program, which will help them respond to the disaster response activities.

- 210 Red Crescent Youth volunteers from 23 districts have been assisted by the Disaster Response Department of the Society for Basic Disaster Response Training which will contribute to the enhancement of the Society's response capacity.
- 100 UDRT members from Bagerhat, Patuakhali, Khulna District and Khulna City Red Crescent Unit have been trained on search and rescue.
- The Department of Youth and Volunteers and the CPP have been assisted to reward 701 Red Crescent Youth volunteers and 106 CPP members for their outstanding contributions to the humanitarian work.
- Before the cyclone YASH landfall, dry food and safe drinking water were distributed among the people at risk who got accommodated in 45 shelter centers through this program.
- Disaster management and first aid training has been provided to 31 volunteers of CPP and Red Crescent Youth.
- Coastal DRR program has expanded its activities at Paikgachha Upazila of Khulna district and subsequently recruited 2000 volunteers as the 42nd Upazila to expand the activities of CPP. Out of them 1991 volunteers four days basic skills development training, 100 unit team leaders received leadership training and 2000 volunteers training on rescue, personal safety equipment, first aid, and signal dissemination materials that will play a significant role in addressing the various risks posed by climate change.
- In preparation for the natural disasters, 30 VHF sets have been provided to keep the CPP's high frequency and very high frequency stations operational.

Integrated Resilience Program (IRP)

- Project Name** : Integrated Resilience Program
- Key Project Activities** : Disaster Risk Reduction, Climate Change Adaptation, Livelihoods, Shelter, Water, Sanitation and Hygiene(WASH), and Community Capacity Building.
- Project Location** : 4 communities at two different Union Parishad namely Noarpara (Tartapara, Maijbari), Parthoshi Union (Muradabad and Sharishabari) under Islampur Upazila of Jamalpur district.
- Project duration** : Three years (2018 to August 2021). Project Partner Name: Swedish Red Cross.

Significant Achievements of IRP Program in 2021:

- Various types of meetings such as PIC Monthly Meeting (8), CDRT Bi-monthly Meeting (12), Women Group quarterly meeting (8), UDRT Bi-monthly meeting (3), Staff coordination meeting (6), Special needs self-help group meeting (24), Annual activity assessment and planning meeting (1), workshop on PWD inclusion in IRP activities (1), Child safety and anti-trafficking workshop for CDMC, CDRT members and Community Organizers (2), First aid and fire safety training (1), awareness raising courtyard sessions and necessary supporting equipment distribution for PWDs (128).
- Out of the selected beneficiaries, 5 have been provided training on masonry and carpentry along with subsequent financial assistance, 7 have been provided training on TV/mobile repair and subsequent financial assistance, 9 have been provided financial assistance for livelihood development by purchasing boat and fishing net, 12 received poultry business training and other 12 received training on small business while all of them received financial assistance for running those business. In addition, 20 persons with disability received training and financial assistance for income generating activities.
- Construction of WASH blocks in 2 schools and ramp in the district social welfare office as well as repairing of 2 bridge/culvers have been completed in 2 communities.
- 2225 students at different schools have received learning materials and 54 CDMC members received financial incentives as an encouragement for humanitarian services.
- DRR training for UDMC members (2), workshop for local stakeholders at upazila level (1), stakeholder meeting on livelihood programs (1), and stakeholder meeting on WASH programs (1).
- BDT 145000 has been provided for reforming emergency relief fund in each of the 4 communities under IRP program.
- As part of COVID-19 response initiative, programs have been carried out such as miking, hand washing, hygiene kits distribution, torch light and whistle, and activation of complaint response mechanism (CRM).

Economic Empowerment of Rural Women (EERW) Program

Project Name : Economic Empowerment of Rural Women (EERW)

Key Project Activities : Economic empowerment through income generation and reduction of gender-based violence by creating employment for marginalized and disadvantaged women.

Project Location : Economic empowerment of 841 women members in a union of Sadar upazila of Nilphamari district and capacity building of 280 stakeholders of this upazila is being implemented.

Project Duration: : Two years and three months (October 2019 to December 2021)

Noteworthy Achievements of EERW Program in 2021

- Different types of meetings like PIC monthly meeting(12), monthly staff coordination meeting (6), work area inspection by PIC (4), Day celebration such as International Women's Day, Begum Rokeya Day, International Day for Disaster Risk Reduction, women's group/ forum meeting at ward level (84), union level women's group / forum meetings (4).
- At the upazila level, three gender and sexual violence prevention trainings were conducted where 119 people participated out of which 87 were women and 32 were men.
- Awareness raising sessions on Gender and Sexual Violence Prevention at family level conducted through 184 courtyard meetings where 841 women members participated. In addition, awareness activities on Gender and Sexual Violence Prevention for officers and volunteers conducted through a training.
- End line evaluation has been carried out after completion of the program implementation.
- There have also been four market linkage workshops on livelihood development, 9 revolving fund formation and 36 revolving fund / savings enhancement meetings, 21 corona virus prevention awareness activities and 12 consultation / complaint response strategy (CRM) meetings conducted at the project's area of intervention.

Forecast-based Financing Program (FbF)

Project Name: Forecast-based Financing Program (FbF)

Key activities of the project: Providing orientation to government officials, BDRCS and CPP volunteers. As well as taking action in advance based on the forecast.

Area of operation of the project: 14 coastal districts, 11 districts along the Jamuna river belt, and Dhaka city.

Project duration: 2015 to 2022

Project Partner Names: German Red Cross, IFRC, American Red Cross, and Swiss Red Cross.

Significant Achievements of the FbF Program in 2021:

- Based on the flood forecast, a total of 22,803 people participated in Manikganj, Rajbari, Sirajganj, Tangail, Kushtia and Kurigram districts out of which 11,137 were women, 11,524 were men and 142 were special needs.
- Beneficiaries have been involved in extensive activities such as flood warning campaigns, video screening of Google flood warning messages, evacuation of people and livestock, houses and other resources by boat and distribution of food to the flood affected families.
- Orientations on the following topics were provided to the Unit Executive Members of Cyclone Prone branches of the Bangladesh Red Crescent Society, CPP Officers and Volunteers and Red Crescent Youth Members in two batches.
- A total of 794 persons divided into 16 batches in 8 districts were imparted training in the different subjects where Red Crescent Society unit executive members, staff, RCY members and government officials took part.
- Based on the heat wave forecasts, the following activities have been implemented in three wards of Dhaka South City Corporation where a total of BDT 886,500/- has been distributed to 197 families at the rate of BDT 4500/- per family. As well as disaster warnings through miking, and distribution of leaflets were carried out. A feasibility study have also been published on the implementation of heat wave forecasting activities.
- Bangladesh Water Development Board (BWDB), Google, A2I, and Bangladesh Red Crescent Society jointly launched digital way for flood forecasting and warning system.
- To speed up forecast based financing activities, Bangladesh Red Crescent Society UK-Met Department, Red Cross Climate Center, Bangladesh Meteorological Department provided online training to 50 staff comprising government officials, Red Crescent officials, field level meteorological department officials for six days who works in the coastal districts that poses severe cyclone risks.
- Based on Hurricane Yash's forecast, 20,000 families in ten coastal districts have been provided with dry food, warning messages through miking, while people, livestock and birds have been evacuated to safe shelter centers.
- The Society's FbF activities have been highlighted in various forums at national and international level, such as the Asia-Pacific Dialogue Platform, Early Action Protocol (EAP) Evaluation Sessions, Asia Pacific Dialogue Platform Urban Disaster Session, Anticipation Hub Conference, UN OCHA's Evaluation of Flood 2020 etc.

Integrated Flood Resilience Program (IFRP)

Project Name: Integrated Flood Resilience Program

Key Project Activities: Disaster Risk Reduction, Climate Change Adaptation, Livelihoods, Shelter, Water Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH), and Community Capacity Building.

Location of the Project Activities: 2 communities in Dimla upazila of Nilphamari district and 2 communities in the Sadar upazila of Lalmonirhat district.

Project duration: Three years (2018 to June 2021).

Project Donor Name: Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the People's Republic of Korea.

Significant Achievements of IFRP Program in 2021:

- Various types of meetings such as PIC Monthly Meeting (10), CDMC Monthly Meeting (24), CDRT Monthly Meeting (16), UDRT Bi-monthly Meetings (5), BDRCS IFRC and KOICA Quarterly Coordination Meeting (2), BDRCS and IFRC Project Management meeting (5), At the family level 192 courtyard meetings were held on sharing early warning messages, and disaster preparedness.
- Conducted 8 health camps on a quarterly basis at the community level as part of the healthcare support program reaching 496 marginalized people (391 women, 99 men and 6 special needs).
- Out of the selected beneficiaries, 60 have been provided financial assistance for construction of hygienic latrines, 12 have been provided training on computer application and mobile repair and subsequent financial assistance for running the business, 29 have been provided training and financial assistance for livelihood development.
- At nine union parishad areas, quarterly Union Disaster Management Committee (UDMC) meetings have been held. Besides, the World Handwashing Day has also been celebrated.
- BDT 1 lakh has been provided for developing an emergency relief fund in each of the 4 communities under IFRP.
- One tree has been planted in each of the selected 1,675 houses. Apart from this, two boats have been provided for emergency rescue work in two different communities.
- Final evaluation has been conducted after completion of the program implementation timeline.
- Four lessons learnt sharing workshops have been conducted at community levels and one workshop at BDRCS National Headquarter.
- A total of 1947 people (1169 women, 761 men and 17 persons with disability) participated in 21 coronavirus awareness programs.

UKAML Project Barishal

The project, funded by UKAID-Match, is being implemented by Bangladesh Red Crescent Society on a field level in 16 communities under 8 wards of Barisal City Corporation with the technical assistance of British Red Cross (BRC).

Significant Achievements of UKAML Program in 2021:

- The source of income has been created by providing cash assistance of BDT 2,500/- among each of the selected 23,500 beneficiary families.
- Livelihood and Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) activities have been conducted especially for the economic development of women and alleviation of poverty. At the same time, the most vulnerable and most marginalized groups of the society (women, children, the elderly and the persons with disability) have been included as the beneficiaries of the project.
- According to the annual plan of action of the project, various types of meetings have been organized in the project area, such as project induction, courtyard meeting, women squad, CDRT and CDMC meeting, and monthly coordination meeting.
- Other activities of the project include community level quiz competitions, COVID-19 preparatory household survey, livelihood and disaster risk reduction workshops for community organizers, Health Education and Social Affairs related household survey, workshop on Community Engagement and Accountability (CEA) for the community organizers has been organized.

Community Development Department

The Community Development (CD) Department of the Bangladesh Red Crescent Society has been implementing four projects to improve the lives and livelihoods of the underprivileged tribes and ethnic minorities in three districts of the Chattogram Hill Tract (CHT) region and Cox's Bazar district. The projects are 1) Economic Security (EcoSec) CHT, 2) Economic Security (EcoSec) Cox's Bazar and 3) Water Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH) in CHT, and 4) Vulnerability to Resilience (V2R) Cox's Bazar. The achievements of this department in the year 2021 are outlined below.

The following activities have been implemented under the EcoSec CHT Project:

- 614 beneficiaries (340 females 274 males) were selected from 13 communities as part of the livelihood development activities at the project area. A total of BDT 19,455,000/- were distributed among the beneficiaries where each family received 30,000 BDT. Besides, technical training was imparted to 23 beneficiaries.
- In the three hill districts, 1456 financially affected families due to lack of income in COVID-19 pandemic, received a total grant of BDT 6,552,000/- is provided at the rate of BDT 4,500/- per family. Apart from this, 624 beneficiaries received training on cropping and vegetable gardening in the courtyards while 598 others have been imparted livestock rearing training.
- CDC meetings and five coordination meetings have been held in the community under livelihood activities in the project area.

Activities Implemented through the ECOSEC Cox's Bazar Project

- In Teknaf, 213 individuals for Micro Economic Initiatives (MEI) and 539 individuals for food production were selected as beneficiaries who subsequently received financial grants.
- A community development committee has been formed for livelihood activities in the project area.
- 3 coordination meetings of Project Implementation Committee (PIC) and one monthly planning meeting have been held.

Activities Implemented through the CHT-WASH Project

- 300 latrines, 16 tubewells and four ring wells have been installed in the project area while 113 tubewells have been repaired. Besides, construction of 6 tubewells and pipelines has been completed.
- In the project areas, different trainings were provided to the beneficiaries such as Participatory Hygiene and Sanitation Transformation (PHAST), Search and Rescue, Children Hygiene Sanitation and Training (CHAST), sanitation marketing, and Tubewell maintenance training for tubewell supervisors.
- In the project community, 577 sets of hygiene kits have been distributed. In addition, chlorine solution powder, mop and other supplies have been provided to 31 hospitals in the three hill districts under the Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) Project.
- In the project community, 6 CDC meetings, 3 coordination meetings of the project implementation committee, 3 stakeholder coordination meetings, 44 courtyard sessions have been completed.
- Water Sanitation and Hygiene Inspection of 731 households completed, 1660 Hygiene Kits were distributed as well as Hand Washing Day was observed in the project area.

Activities Accomplishments through V2R Cox's Bazar Project

- In the first phase, a total of 503 households in 10 communities have been provided hygienic single offset pit latrine assistance through a survey of the project area. In the second phase, a total of 538 hygienic single offset pit latrines have been provided to 6 communities. And as the groundwater level in the other three communities is quite high, the process of installing twin pit latrines has started there. A latrine has already been set up experimentally in Dakshin Para.
- Training has been provided to 18 masons from seven communities and concerned COs and CDMC members for monitoring the installation of sanitary latrines.
- A total of BDT 15,769,000/- financial assistance has been provided to 1186 families in one installment of BDT 3000/- and 1163 families in three installments of BDT 10,500/- each time. In addition, 12 varieties of vegetable/plant seeds have been distributed to 2,510 families in 10 communities considering the nutritional needs of families during winter season.

- 180 households have been provided with LPG gas cylinder stoves to address the energy crisis and ensure low-cost fuel supply.
- Over a period of total 20 days activities undertaken including miking and distribution of leaflet, stickers and roman banners at each community in two phases to spread the COVID-19 awareness messages. In addition, a total of 300 courtyard meetings have been organized on proper hand washing and raising awareness against COVID-19 infection.
- A total of 29,790 face masks were made, nine for each of total 3310 families in ten communities under the project intervention area. 28 women beneficiaries of the V2R project who are also skilled in sewing took part in this process. As part of the Cash for Work initiative, a total of BDT 479,360/- was paid for this task where each of them received 17,120/- Taka.
- 10 Community Organizers have received two days training on Gender Awareness, Community Participation and Accountability, and facilitating sessions at communities. In addition, one session on gender-based violence was conducted with CDMC and women's groups in each of the 10 communities.
- Through the household survey, 1181 beneficiaries were finally selected for unconditional financial assistance. And a total of BDT 12,000/- unconditional cash grant is underway in three installments. In each community there are two (one at the entrance and one at the exit) maps of resources and risks in the form of billboards are set up.
- Likewise every year, on 13 October of this year, the V2R project, in conjunction with the local administration, celebrated International Day for Disaster Risk Reduction where activities such as rally, discussion meetings, and firefighting mock drills aimed at raising awareness were arranged.

Cyclone Preparedness Programme

As a joint program of the Government of Bangladesh (GoB) and the Bangladesh Red Crescent Society, the Cyclone Preparedness Program (CPP), which has been already functioning with immense global recognition as a role model for disaster management, has been working successfully in the coastal areas of Bangladesh. The major disaster management pursuits being carried out through this program includes early warning, evacuation, search and rescue, first aid, relief and rehabilitation in case of cyclone and storm surge across the coastal belt of Bangladesh.

There are 7 regional offices under the control of the Head Office of the Cyclone Preparedness Program (CPP) situated at Moghbazar in Dhaka district. Under the regional offices, there are 42 Upazilas in 13 Coastal Districts. 365 Unions and 3801 Units are there under the Upazila Offices. Recently, gender equality has been adopted in the CPP volunteer structure. At present, 20 people are deployed (10 women and 10 men) as volunteers in each unit. Every unit has five working divisions, namely (a) signaling and publicity, (b) shelter, (c) search and rescue, (d) first aid and (e) humanitarian relief assistance. There are 4 volunteers (2 men and 2 women) working in each of the aforementioned department. The Ministry of Disaster Management and Relief of the Government of Bangladesh has received the "United Nations Public Service Award 2021" in the category of "Gender Responsive Services" in recognition of the CPP's women empowerment initiative in 2021. Notable accomplishments of CPP in 2021 are presented below:

Training and Meetings of Volunteers and Staff

- A total of 26177 volunteers (13090 women and 13089 men) have been trained through the capacity building activities at 655 centers under 42 upazilas of the cyclone preparedness program.
- An information-rich volunteer database of all CPP volunteers has been prepared with an updated total of 76,140 data (38070 women and 38070 men).
- This year 14 signaling devices have been provided in 13 upazilas where 19,590 volunteers are working.
- Throughout this reporting year, a total of 4,100 people participated in the disaster preparedness rally while 41,000 volunteers took part in the mock drills in 41 upazilas with an equal participation of men and women.
- A total of 113 people have received this year's Best Volunteer Award, of which 84 are CPP volunteers, 20 are from other organizations, 6 are retired volunteers and 3 are entrepreneurs.
- In 2021, a total of 103 meetings of 41 Upazila Committees and 730 meetings of 355 Union Committees were held where the members of the committees were present.
- On the occasion of the 50th anniversary of the CPP, a special mock drill was organized in Cox's Bazar where 4,000 volunteers participated directly which was witnessed by approximately 25,000 local people. About 21,000 volunteers including Hon'ble Prime Minister from Ganobhaban, Hon'ble Minister of State of MoDMR from Osmani Memorial Auditorium, other Hon'ble Ministers including Secretaries, MPs, Chiefs of the three defense forces, senior government officials and senior officials from Cox's Bazar witnessed the event online.
- On behalf of the Prime Minister, the Hon'ble State Minister of MoDMR conferred "Lifetime Achievement Award" to 9 volunteers at a function organized at the Osmani Memorial Auditorium on the occasion of 50th anniversary of CPP.
- A total of 6 employees from CPP have been awarded the Integrity Award.


Activities of projects under the department

- Under the Coastal Disaster Risk Reduction Project, CPP activities have been expanded in Paikgachha upazila of Khulna district where 2000 new volunteers have been recruited in 100 units of 10 unions. This year a total of 200 volunteers have been trained in 5 batches in Sharankhola, Kalapara, Paikgachha from the project.
- A joint venture between CPP and Action Aid has provided training on women leadership and prevention of violence against women to enhance the skills and empowerment of women volunteers where about 8,000 volunteers have been trained.



Restoring Family Link Department

The significant activities of the Restoring Family Links Department in the year 2021 include tracing of missing individual in the country and abroad, collection of search forms, updating information about foreign detainees, exchange of family messages, jail visits and services to the detainees, searching/ tracing for the missing person, organizing various meeting and workshop, screening documentaries, organizing meeting at the field level to exchange views, conducting orientation for relevant authorities. In the month of November 2020, 42 individuals living in the camp of Forcibly Displaced Myanmar Nationals in Cox's Bazar were trapped by the traffickers and were on their way to cross the Bay to migrate to Malaysian through an Engine-driven boat. From the start of the journey, they were traceless for many days. The National Headquarters of the Society and the RFL team of the Cox's Bazar Red Crescent Unit collected the names, addresses, and contact numbers of the families of those missing persons. Afterward, the Society, with the support of ICRC, communicated with the RFL team of the Malaysian Red Crescent Society. Later on, it was revealed that the missing persons first stayed in a temporary camp in Langkawi of Malaysia called "Camp Waosan IDC" and afterward they were shifted to "IDC Sangai Bikap and Bidare" in June 2021. Bangladesh Red Crescent Society informed all these updates to the family members of all those missing persons and followed by continued communication and information sharing about the RFL services.

Disaster Response Department



31,955 individuals received Hygiene Kits, 5,950 pcs of Tarpaulin distributed, 2,880 pcs of mats distributed, 500 pcs of CGI sheets distributed



11,720 individuals infected by COVID-19 virus were reached through Ambulance Services, 22,810 individuals reached through Oxygen Cylinder service.



BDT 1,250,077,500 were distributed among the 277,795 most-affected families as a part of multi-purpose cash distribution. Besides, 1,925 families were supported through Cash for Work activities.



4,750 households received support of latrine construction and other WASH related services.



97,500 families received face masks, 16,000 hand sanitizer, 2195 pcs of the Pulse Oximeter, 1825 PPE set, and 8,000 mosquito nets under the health care service program.



459250 packets of emergency dry food, food package and cooked food and Ramadan Food packages were distributed across the country as a part of the emergency response as well as regular services of the Society.



30,350 pcs of Blankets were distributed among the cold wave struck poor and marginalized families.



13,780 families were provided support for the creation of livelihood opportunities.



1,438 families were provided support for the reconstruction of shelters that were damaged by the disaster.

Below are the updates of various project and response operation programs completed under the Disaster Response Department:

COVID-19 Response Operation

Food Package Distribution

- Food packages have been distributed among 27,200 families through 68 Red Crescent Units with the support of Qatar Red Crescent and a Taiwan-based NGO.
- Cooked food has been distributed among 167,850 individuals through 19 Red Crescent Units with support from IFRC.
- Ramadan Food packages have been distributed among 16,000 families affected by COVID-19 pandemic in 7 Red Crescent Units.

Cash grant distribution

- With the support of IFRC, a total of Taka 9,715,000 was distributed in 11 Units of BDRCS among 3,886 families at a rate of Taka 2,500 for each family who had their livelihood/ source of income affected due to COVID-19 pandemic.
- With the support of the Danish Red Cross, an amount of Taka 13,500,000 was distributed in 3 Units of BDRCS among 3,000 women-headed families at a rate of Taka 4,500 for each family who had their livelihood/ source of income affected due to COVID-19 pandemic.
- With the support of the Swiss Red Cross, an amount of Taka 37,000,000 was distributed among the Slum dwellers in Narayganj and Gajipur City Corporation area. Each family received Taka 10,000 which was distributed in two phases.

Ambulance service

- Emergency Ambulance service was provided to 2,344 COVID-19 infected patients through 21 Ambulances in 21 Districts with the support from IFRC.

Oxygen Cylinder service

- With the support of IFRC and ICRC, emergency Oxygen services were provided to 4,562 COVID-19 infected patients across the country by providing 740 units of Oxygen concentrators, 512 units of oxygen cylinders, 12 units of the high-flow nasal cannula in 68 Units of the Society, and the MCH centers, Hospitals, Blood centers operated by the Society.

Distribution of Oximeter and personal protective equipment

- 439 units of oximeters were distributed in 68 Units with the support from IFRC and ICRC
- 365 units of PPE were distributed in 23 Units of BDRCS
- 19,500 pcs of Masks were distributed in 21 Units of BDRCS
- 3,300 pcs of Hand Sanitizer were distributed in 17 Units of BDRCS
- Nebulizers were distributed in 21 Units of BDRCS

Cyclone Arphan Response Operations

- A total amount of Taka 11,250,000 was distributed with the support of IFRC in 3 Districts (Khulna, Satkhira and Bagerhat) among 2,500 affected families with a rate of Taka 4,500 for each family.
- A total amount of Taka 1,500,000 was distributed among 300 families who have special needs at a rate of Taka 5,000 for each family.
- 200 Bundle of CGI Sheet were distributed among 100 families of Dakop Upazila under Khulna District.
- Food package and hygiene parcel was distributed among 4,000 families in 4 Districts with the support from HSBC Bank.

Cyclone Amphan Recovery Operation

- A total amount of Taka 6,250,000 was distributed among 250 families of Sutakhali Union of Dakop Upazial under Khulna District. Each family received Taka 25,000 as a cash grant support for livelihood development.
- Under the food for work activity, a total amount of Taka 1,200,000 was distributed among 150 families at a rate of Taka 8,000 for each family. The cash was transferred in two installments.
- A total amount of Taka 10,000,000 (one crore) was distributed among 250 families in a rate of Taka 40,000 for each family as a cash grant support for the construction and repairing of their houses.
- A total amount of Taka 4,500,000 was distributed among 250 families at a rate of Taka 18,000 to each family as a cash grant for hygienic latrine construction and repair.
- 3,000 tree saplings have been distributed among 500 families.
- A total amount of Taka 2,500,000 was distributed among 250 families at a rate of Taka 10,000 as a cash grant support for procuring a water tank for rainwater harvesting.
- Life Jackets as part of life-saving equipment were distributed among 250 individuals.

Cyclone Yash Response Operation

- A total amount of Taka 45 lakh was distributed in three districts (Patuakhali, Barguna, and Bagerhat) among 1,000 families at a rate of Taka 4,500 for each family with the financial support from IFRC.
- A total amount of taka 2 lakh 50 thousand (Tk. 250,000) was distributed among 50 families with special needs at a rate of Taka 5,000 for each family.
- A total amount of taka 16 lakh (1,600,000) was distributed among 200 families from Patuakhali and Barguna District as a part of Cash for Work activities. Each family received taka 8,000 in two installments.
- Dry food was distributed among 9,500 cyclone affected families of Bhola, Barguna, Patuakhali, Pirojpur, Bagerhat, Satkhira and Khulna Districts.
- Tarpaulin and hygiene parcels were distributed among 1,000 families of Bhola, Barguna, Patuakhali, and Pirojpur districts.

Flood Response Operation

Activities implemented under 2019 flood recovery operation

- A total amount of Taka 90 lakh (tk 9,000,000) was distributed among 250 families of Tangail and Sirajgonj District at a rate of Taka 18,000 to each family as a cash grant for construction new or repair of hygienic latrine.
- Cash grant of taka 25,000 was distributed to one family of Tangail District for livelihood development. In addition, a total amount of taka 1 lakh (100,000) was distributed among 5 families of Sirajgonj district with taka 20,000 to each family as a part of "Model Livelihood" activity. The with cash grant for livelihood, vegetable cultivation through hydroponics method was piloted and hands on training was provided among the program participants on cultivation of cattle fodder. The activities were replicated by the other participants/beneficiaries of the project.



Flash flood 2021 response

During 20-22 October 2021, the Tista river basin especially in the Lalmonirhat, Rangpur, Nilphamary, and Kurigram Districts was inundated by a sudden flash flood. Cash grant was distributed among the 1,000 most affected families of three Unions under Hatibandha Upazila of Lalmonirhat Districts. A total amount of taka 45 lakh (4,500,000) was distributed among 1,000 families at a rate of taka 4,500 to each family.

Qurbani Meat Distribution

With the financial support of the Turkish Red Crescent, Qurbani Meat was distributed among the poorest and COVID-19 affected families. 10,000 families of Dhaka, Chattogram, Cox's Bazar, Jheniadah, Magura, Patuakhali and Barguna districts received 2 kg Qurbani meat each.

Bhasanchar Operation

An influx of about 1.2 million Forcibly Displaced Myanmar Nationals crossed the border and take shelter in the makeshift camps in Cox's Bazar in 2017. The Government of Bangladesh has constructed the necessary infrastructure in Bashanchar to relocate the Forcibly Displaced Myanmar Nationals living in Cox's Bazar. Later on, the relocation of Forcibly Displaced Myanmar Nationals into Bashanchar had formally started in December 2020. The Bangladesh Red Crescent Society was requested by the Government of Bangladesh to provide humanitarian assistance to the Forcibly Displaced Myanmar Nationals living in Bashanchar. In this connection, non-food items such as hygiene box, dignity kits, home dustbins, seeds etc. were distributed among 1,200 relocated Myanmar nationals with the support from IFRC. In addition, 856 Myanmar Nationals living in Bhashanchar and 278 local Bangladesh Nationals were supported to get COVID-19 vaccines.

Training and workshop

For capacity development of Officials, Volunteers and Community members, the Disaster Response Department of the Society organized various training and workshop throughout the reporting year. The significant training and workshops include a). Training on First Aid and Search and Rescue (194 staff and volunteers), b). National Disaster Response Team (NDRT) training (60 staff and volunteers), c). National Disaster WASH Response Team (NDWRT) training (30 staff and volunteers), d). Unit level emergency WASH training (60 persons), e). Basic Response Training for Facilitators and UDRT (222 individuals), f). Cash Strategy and Cash SOP Write-shop (75 staff and volunteers), and g). Menstrual Hygiene Management (30 individuals).

BDRCS – Swiss Red Cross Urban Empowerment and Resilience Project

- On-set double chamber latrines were constructed for 37 families
- Handwashing basins were installed for 400 families living in Slums
- For solid waste management, two temporary MRF were installed. 94.5 tons of compost fertilizer were produced from those solid waste management plants. Besides, 15 Bins were constructed at the community level.

COVID-19 recovery project of Swiss Red Cross

- A total amount of Taka 1,375,000 was distributed among 275 adversely impacted families from COVID-19. Each of the 275 families received taka 5,000 cash grant.
- A total amount of taka 3,000,000 was distributed among 200 small traders/ business owners who were affected by COVID-19 pandemic. Each of the business owners was given taka 15,000 cash grant.
- In addition, in order to provide rapid emergency assistance during disaster, the information was collected from all families 8 Unions under Fulchari Upazila of Gaibandha District.

E-WASH Project

30 thousand pieces of IEC materials containing 8 types of messages on mass awareness raising were distributed under the E-WASH project funded by Japan Red Cross. Besides, initiatives were taken to distribute 350 menstrual hygiene management (MHM) kits as a part of emergency relief.

Respond to small and medium scale disasters

- In order to facilitate providing immediate emergency assistance during any disaster in 8 Coastal Districts, 50 pcs tarpaulin, sleeping mat, mosquito nets were distributed as a part of emergency Disaster Preparedness (DP) stock.
- Tarpaulin, Hygiene Parcel, Kitchen set, dignity kits were distributed among 15 families affected by fire incident in Cumilla Districts.
- Hygiene Parcel and Mosquito Nets were distributed among 176 affected families from fire incidents across Dhaka city.
- A total amount of Taka 1 lakh 25 thousand (1,25,000) was distributed among the 25 affected families of violence and fire incidents.

Myanmar Refugee Relief Operation (MRRO) Program

- With the support of UNHCR, the Society has been implementing Myanmar Refugee Relief Operation (MRRO) program in Cox's Bazar. The major activities of the program include distribution of Core Relief Items – NFI & LPG among the Forcibly Displaced Myanmar Nationals living in the camps, cash grants distribution among the host community members who have been affected due to the influx of people and their accommodation, and reducing humanitarian risks through disaster risk reduction activities.
- The Society in the year 2021, with the financial support from UNHCR, had provided humanitarian assistance by distributing relief items among 5,00,000 refugees from 1,00,000 families including the Rohingya Refugees who arrived during the recent influx.

Cash Grant Distribution:

- In 2021, among the affected local host communities under Cox's Bazar Sadar, Maheshkhali and Kutubdia Upazilas, a cash grant of taka 2500 was distributed through BKash among 15,038 families.
- Besides, various Disaster Risk Reduction activities were undertaken under the MRRO program in 2021. Organizing training on Disaster Preparedness and Emergency Response was the most significant one of those various activities. In addition, there was training on sensitization about early warning, fire safety, landslide/ hill slides, and floods. A total of 1201 participants participated in those training. At the camp level, training for Disaster Management Unit was one of the important training where 400 participants participated. In addition, training on Fire Fighting was organized in 16 camps through which 8750 participants were able to increase their knowledge and awareness.
- In 2021, temporary accommodation was arranged for the newly arrived 1077 families in the transit center and facilitated the relocation of 1072 families.



The Population Movement Operation (PMO)

Bangladesh Red Crescent Society under its Population Movement Operation (PMO) has been providing health, medical, nutrition, shelter, drinking water, sanitation and hygiene management services to the forcibly displaced Myanmar Nationals living in the make-shift camps in Ukhiya and Teknaf Upazila of Cox's Bazar district. Bangladesh Red Crescent Society, with the overall support from IFRC, 11 Red Cross Red Crescent partner National Societies, is currently working in 16 camps and 4 Unions to provide humanitarian assistance to 200,000 forcibly displaced Myanmar Nationals and livelihood development support to 60,000 host community members.

Health and Medical Treatment support services are provided through a Field Hospital, a COVID-19 Isolation and Treatment center, 5 Primary Health Care Center (PHC), and 7 Health Posts. Alongside of services from static centers, the services are also provided at the doorsteps of the people living in the camps through CBHF and community-based outreach activities. Psychosocial services are provided from all health centers as well as from 3 Psychosocial Service Centers in the 1st and 2nd phases. Construction work of the Mother and Child Health Center in Teknaf Upazial has been recently completed. In addition to Health and Medical Treatment services, the Society is operating four distribution centers, two Fecal Sludge Management Plant, and two solid waste management plants inside the camps.

As a part of Water Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH) programs, the Society provided safe drinking water services, water network system construction, shallow tube-well (27 unit) installation, repair and maintenance of deep and shallow tube-well/ water points (1310 units), water tap stand installation (45 unit) and repair (86), latrine construction (941 units), bathing cubicle construction (32 units), bathing cubicle repairing (669 units). Besides, hand-washing basin construction (941), hygiene kits distribution (5821 sets), hygiene top-up kits (92,888 sets), and personal protective equipment were distributed.

Under the Health, Medical treatment, psychosocial support (PSS) and community mobilization programs, there is the Field Hospital, Primary Health Care Centers (PHC), Health Posts (HP), Psychosocial Services (PSS) and Community based Health and First Aid (CBHFA) activities.

As a part of COVID-19 response program, 7057 individuals received medical treatment services from Outpatient Department (OPD), indoor IDP, treatment for COVID positive patients, sample collection and lab testing etc. In addition, the major activities implemented under COVID-19 Community Mobilization Program include COVID-19 awareness-raising message dissemination, raising awareness on maintaining physical distance, using face masks, regular hand washing as well as referral to the IITC for symptomatic cases.

As a part of Protection Gender and Inclusion (PGI) activities services were provided through the Dignity Access and Participation (DAPS) centers among 100,815 individuals (Female-51,515 and male-49,300). In addition, 8 capacity development training, 200 sessions on positive parenting, and awareness-raising message dissemination sessions on GBV, SGVB, PSEA, and COVID-19 were conducted and a total of 72,548 individuals attended. The other PGI activities include referral case management services, post hygiene kits distribution sessions, committee formation, and awareness-raising on anti-trafficking, child protection, sexual harassment and violence, protection at family and in the society, PSEA, COVID-19 etc. Awareness messaging about how to use the dignity kits during the distribution of Dignity Kits, PGI mainstreaming workshop, etc. were organized.

Community Engagement and Accountability (CEA) activity include 70 community Radio Listening programs, two meetings with Imam and Majhis, information sharing about COVID-19 and services of BDRCS through 17,341 outreach activities, training on CEA to 15 staff and community-based volunteers, services provided to 4527 individuals through Feedback and Information centers, 82 community consultation sessions for selection of beneficiaries, 125 community meetings and 60 orientation sessions on CEA at the community level.





Health Service Holy Family Red Crescent Medical College and Hospital Blood Programme

Bangladesh Red Crescent Society (BDRCS) is well-known throughout the country for its health-care institutions, blood centers, and maternal and child health facilities. BDRCS is also recognized for its emergency health services during disasters. The organization is also working to gradually improve the quality of health services by focusing on quality improvement, social inclusion, and capacity building in order to deal with changing disaster and health-risk scenarios. Simultaneously, effort is being done to increase the skills of volunteers and staffs so that they can work for people to live a safe, dignified and healthy life.

Bangladesh Red Crescent Society (BDRCS) is attempting to develop the institutional capacity of health-care institutions. Emphasis has also been laid on strengthening the financial capacity of institutions so that healthcare can continue to be provided to marginalized communities. Health care for the most vulnerable communities is one of the key components of disaster risk reduction. In this regard, learning and experiences are being used to formulate integrated operational plans of the organization.

BDRCS has been attempting to develop the institutional capacity of healthcare institutions. Simultaneously, preparations have been completed to manage all of BDRCS's health care institutions using a sustainable management system.

Health Service Department

The health service department of the Bangladesh Red Crescent Society has been working to improve healthcare quality and meet the needs of children and mothers. Like last year, in 2021 the health department undertook various activities and offered services through various hospitals, and maternity and children's healthcare centers located across the country during the coronavirus emergency.

Furthermore, the department has been working to restore mental health and psychosocial well-being that has been affected by natural disasters and other crises. Aim to these, BDRCS implementing variety of programmes, including emergency healthcare, maternal and child mortality reduction, first aid and infection prevention, and psychological support in COVID-19 situations.

Successful activities of the Health Department:

- The Shaheed Mayazuddin Matri Sadan Centre is being renovated as part of the society's health department initiatives. Furthermore, the department renovated 10 mother and child health clinics and provided medical equipment to 35 mother and child health centers.
- 66 midwives were trained in reproductive health, maternal health, newborns, children, and adolescents to increase the quality of care at maternal child health centers. This initiative aims to improve the quality of service provided by MCH centers.
- The health department is playing an important role to support for treatment of COVID-19 infected patients in this year. Providing safety and awareness training for volunteer and distribution of health safety items such as masks, gloves, sanitizers, and soaps etc. were distributed by the COVID-19 programme of this department.



COVID-19 Response of the Bangladesh Red Crescent Society -

The following activities implemented in 2021 under the project are: Providing awareness training on COVID-19 to staff and youth volunteers at the national headquarters, 5 million alcohol pads were handed over to civil surgeons and chief health officers in 64 districts and 4 city corporations of the country. In addition, 3.76 million masks and 60,000 hand sanitizers have been distributed. A total of 1,561 volunteers took part in various events (547 females and 1014 males).

Institutionalization of Mental Health and Psychosocial support of the Bangladesh Red Crescent Society

As part of the project intervention in 2021, the following actions were carried out: providing training in psychological first aid (PFA); stress reduction sessions were implemented along with Self-care sessions for employees and youth volunteers have been held. Additionally, World Mental Health Day is also observed. 1838 people (662 women and 1176 males) took part in 41 different activities.

Cox's Bazar Health Care Project -

The following activities has been carried out in the year 2021 under the Project: Ensured supply of safe drinking water through water treatment plants, disposal of general and infectious waste of the hospital through the medical waste management site and arrange hospital cleaning campaign, Delivering healthcare and medical care to 2,25,075 persons, along with the recruitment of one emergency medical officer and two senior staff nurses for the field hospital.



Holy Family Red Crescent Hospital

Various programs were implemented in 2021 under the initiative of Holy Family Red Crescent Hospital, including the commemoration of International Mother Language Day, the birth anniversary and martyrdom anniversary of the nation's father, Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, and the celebration of Independence Day. Furthermore from that, improved food distribution and incentive programs for hospital employees have been carried out on the occasion of the holy Eid-ul-Fitr and the holy Eid-ul-Adha.

Successful activities implemented this year:

- The following are the hospital's development and modernization efforts undertaken this year with the financial support of numerous institutions:
- On the upper roof of the hospital's food department, a full-fledged hall room has been constructed.
- In the hospital, a modern RTPCR lab serving as a corona detection unit has been established and commissioned.
- In order to provide medical facilities to the admitted more critical patients, an additional five beds have been added to extend the existing ICU of the hospital and provide necessary oxygen supply line connections and medical equipment.
- A new generator with a capacity of 500 KVA, funded by the American Embassy in Bangladesh, has been supplied and installed at various locations throughout the hospital to ensure an uninterrupted supply of electricity. A modern washing machine for cleaning the clothes used by patients and 05 water purifying machines have also been supplied and installed.
- A 36-bed specialist clinic was set-up on top of the hospital's radiology department to provide particular treatment to kidney patients.
- As part of the nephrology department's modernization project, two hospital wards were renovated and modernized.



Holy Family Red Crescent Medical College

In the academic year 2020-2021, 145 students have been admitted to MBBS programs at Holy Family Red Crescent Medical College. There are 690 students enrolled in the college, with 111 of them being international students. Every academic year, 7 and 2 students, respectively, are offered the opportunity to study for free in MBBS and BDS programs through the poor and talented quotas. Aside from that, it is worth noting that three students are admitted each year under the independence fighters' quota, and 45 percent (excluding reserved seats) are admitted to medical colleges under government rules.

Dental Unit: Approval has been obtained to admit 40 students per academic year by increasing the number of seats in the Holy Family Red Crescent Medical College Dental Unit. At present, a total of 130 students are studying BDS courses out of which 5% of student are getting the opportunity to study free of cost as per government rules.

Hostel for Female Student: 50 female students are accommodated on the sixth floor of the academic building, and lodging for around 410 students, both new and old, is given. To improve the living amenities for female students, a 15-story modern and international quality student hostel building is being built with government funds by PWD.

Library: A modern library with all facilities for academic studies in class and hospital has been set up in the basement of the college building. Where about 4,000 books/journals of the latest edition preserved with internet connectivity.



Holy Family Red Crescent Nursing College:

The following activities have been completed in 2021 under the Holy Family Red Crescent Nursing College:

- The process of publishing the notification and submitting the application form and sending the application form along with the BDRCS file for the appointment of principal, vice-principal, assistant professor and lecturer of nursing college has been completed.
- In order to complete the formal recruitment process under the regulation of Dhaka University, the application has been processed to hon'ble vice-chancellor for the nomination as principal appointment committee, 2 (two) members and 1 (one) member of teachers of the recruitment committee.
- According to the regulations of the University of Dhaka, an application has been submitted to the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor for the nomination of two members for the appointment committee of Principals and one member for the teacher's recruitment committee.

- The notification for the admission of 40 students to the continuing Bsc in Nursing (4 years) course and 70 to the diploma in nursing science and midwifery (3 years) programme was published in the national daily newspaper for the session 2020-2021.
- With the expiration of the term of the governing body for the management of the college, the application process has been done for the re-constitution of the 2nd Governing Body for nomination, along with the name of the Hon'ble Chairman to the Vice-Chancellor of Dhaka University.
- In 2021, after the publication of advertisements (internal) for the two ongoing courses in the college, as an admission process, the distribution, acceptance, verification, selection of forms is completed by completing the health check-up on the pre-determined date.
- In 2021, following the publishing of internal advertisements for the two ongoing courses at the college, the distribution, acceptance, verification, and selection of forms is completed by completing the health check-up on the pre-determined day.
- In addition to the aforementioned initiatives, various activities of college were performed like in-person classes for students, online classes, and government-mandated batch-based examinations being conducted.



The Blood Program

The BDRCS Blood Programme is actively trying to meet 10% of the country's total blood or blood component demand through a total of 8 blood centers across the country and a sub-center located at the Holy Family Red Crescent Medical College Hospital. The Blood Programme encouraged voluntary blood donors to donate blood and organized volunteer blood collection programs in the Society's 68 branches with the assistance of youth volunteers.

As a result, in 2021, a significant number of people across the country are contributing to the meeting of the national blood needs by donating blood selflessly in the society's blood program.

In the current year, 58,145 bags of blood and blood components have been collected and 69,746 bags of blood and blood components have been distributed.

Successful activities implemented this year:

- In collaboration with the Australian Red Cross and IFRC, the Australian Government's grant has been used for the purchase of blood bags, Apheresis Kits, Rapid Test Kits for Anti HBsAg, Anti-HCV, Anti-HIV, Syphilis, Malaria Parasite, Freezer for FFP equipment for the Mohammadpur Blood Center.
- Additionally, the American Red Cross is assisting with the purchase of several types of blood bags.
- Blood and blood bags are being delivered to hospitals serving Rohingya refugees in Cox's Bazar and Bhashanchar.
- About 10,000 bags of blood for thalassemia patients, about 3,000 bags of platelets for dengue patients and FFP have been provided on emergency basis at Sheikh Hasina National Burn Institute.



The Bangladesh Red Crescent Society (BDRCS) is undergoing some of changes as an organization. Some of these altered circumstances are internal, while others are external. These transformations are putting pressure on management day by day to remain relevant to the changing conditions and to make the BDRCS capabilities well-refined, expanded, and timely.

This twenty-first century, with its attendant problems, resolutions, and changes, is an excellent lesson for everyone. This learning has pushed the organization to become more organized and self-sufficient.

It wishes to collaborate with all members of the Red Cross and Red Crescent movement in order to achieve the goal of working for the organization's development in the coming years. Human resource development, logistical development, unit development, information technology development, youth and volunteer development are at the center of this development strategy. Economic self-sufficiency, transparency and accountability, and long-term sustainable development activities are the major drivers of these development strategies.

All units, including volunteers, officers, and employees, as well as the management board, are working on developing action plans while keeping the overall development program and its objectives in mind.

Training Department:

The Bangladesh Red Crescent Society's Training Department, as it does every year, has delivered numerous trainings to national and international institutions, as well as its own volunteers and employees, in order to create a skilled population in 2021. Furthermore, the BDRCS Training Department performed training under several projects with the assistance of partner organizations. In 2021, a total of eight trainings were conducted and these significant trainings are:

- First aid training.
- First aid and search and rescue training.
- First aid and fire safety training.
- Early concepts of first aid.
- Refreshment training in first aid.
- Trainer training.
- Search and rescue training.
- Fire drill.

The skills and capabilities of volunteers, including Society employees, were enhanced as a result by participated in this training. In addition, training is organized for employees from various organizations based on demand. An evaluation session is prepared for the participants at the end of the training to check the applicability of the knowledge obtained. The assessment results show that the knowledge received from the program was beneficial to the participants.

Participants got an early awareness of fire safety and learned how to use fire extinguishers while participating in both search and rescue training and fire exercises.



Planning and Development Department

Strategic Plan of Bangladesh Red Crescent Society 2021-2025

The Bangladesh Red Crescent Society's 6th Strategic Plan 2021-2025 was unveiled in the presence of the Society's Honorary Chairman Major General (Retd) ATM Abdul Wahab, with the overall guidance of the Society's Governing board members and under the coordination of Planning and Development department.

Honorable members of the Society's Governing Board, representatives of the concerned Ministries of the Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh, representatives of various embassies located in Bangladesh, representatives of the IFRC, ICRC, representatives of In-country PNSs working in Bangladesh, Directors of all departments of the Society, and officials of various levels of the Society were present.

The process of preparing Bangladesh Red Crescent Society's 6th Strategic Plan 2021-2025 was presented in the first session. Later, in accordance with the Society's 2021 Action Plan, a session was held on the successes of distinct steps and the likely action plan for 2022, during which the directors of various departments of the Society presented their departments' achievements and future plans.



Write shop on Strategic Plan 2021-2025

In order to wrap up the finalization process of the strategic plan 2021-2025, 68 units, movement partners, and officials at all levels completed the systematic method, and above important, the writing shop was arranged with the involvement of members of the Governing Board. Various adjustments and recommendations were reviewed and incorporated into the strategic plan, which was presented and approved at the Managing Board meeting no 269 on March 15, 2021.

Governance Orientation for new members of the Society's Board of Management

A workshop on Governance Orientation was held on June 27, 2021 under the initiative of the Planning and Development department under National Society Development for the new members of the Society's Governing Board (Ad Hoc Committee). The orientation was briefed in detail about the International Red Cross Red Crescent Movement, the activities of the Bangladesh Red Crescent Society and its objectives and the new strategic plan of the Society 2021-2025. Members of the Ad Hoc Managing Board, including the Chairman of the Society, and representatives of IFRC, ICRC were presented in this orientation session.

Network Red: Sessions from BDRCS

The Planning and Development Department hosted a Branch Development session through the Lens of Branch Development Capacity Assessment (BOCA) and focused on the Strategic Planning Process and our Agenda for Renewal, One NS One NSD Plan in three sessions on December 6-8, 2021 on behalf of the Society. In those sessions it was highlighted various branch development activities of the National Society Development (NSD) to the global level virtually.

Solidarity fund

For the first time, the Bangladesh Red Crescent Society solidarity fund has been founded by the Movement Partners and with the financial support of various projects in order to overcome any undesirable loss (accident, illness, hospital treatment, death, and other relevant damages that can be financially supported) while engaging (On-duty) in the activities of the Bangladesh Red Crescent Society for the volunteers and staffs from all levels of the society. The Fund's establishment was overseen by the Planning and Development department.

Federation Wide Data and Reporting System (FDRS) 2020

The skills and capabilities of volunteers, including Society employees, were enhanced as a result by participated in this training. In addition, training is organized for employees from various organizations based on demand. An evaluation session is prepared for the participants at the end of the training to check the applicability of the knowledge obtained. The assessment results show that the knowledge received from the program was beneficial to the participants.

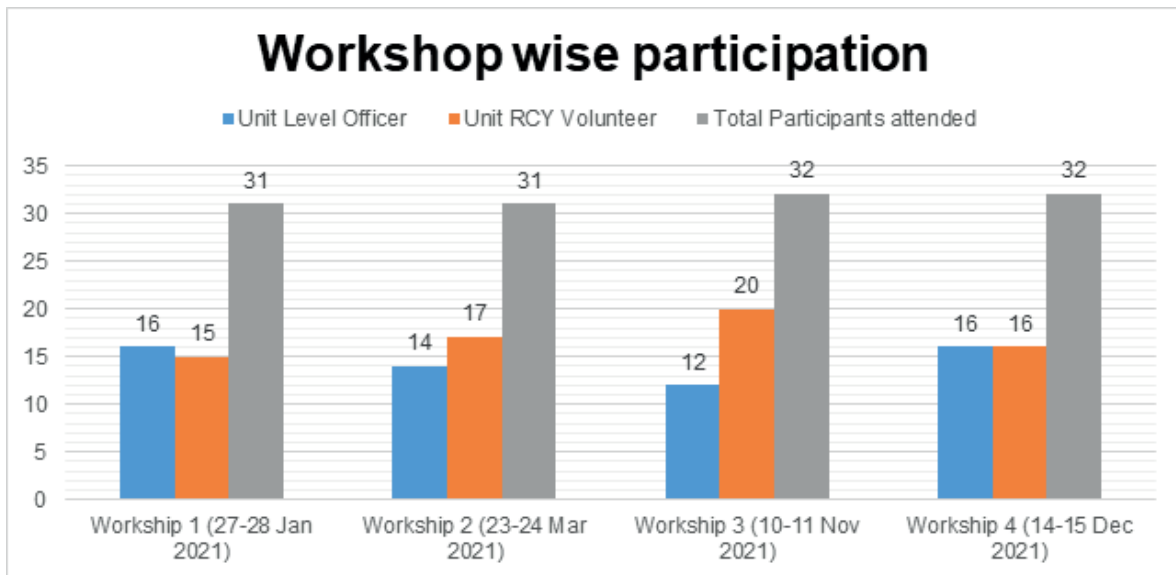
Participants got an early awareness of fire safety and learned how to use fire extinguishers while participating in both search and rescue training and fire exercises.

Effective Skill Development (Supply of ICT Equipment to National Headquarters & Units):

ICT equipment, such as 17 All in One Desktop Computers, 7 Laptops, 17 Printers, 17 Scanners, 2 Multimedia Projectors, and so on, is provided to various departments and units of the National Headquarters through the National Society Development Initiatives (NSD Initiatives) to ensure digitalization at all levels of the Society.

Central Database and Information Management System:

This year (2021), four 2-day workshops on Bangladesh Red Crescent Society's Central Database and Information Management System (mis.bdracs.org) were held in the National Headquarters training room of Bangladesh Red Crescent Society under the initiative of Planning and Development department to achieve digitalization objectives of Bangladesh Red Crescent Society's Strategic Plan 2021-25. (mis.bdracs.org). Through these workshops, all 68 units' unit-level officers and volunteers from each unit are trained on CDIMS and various important topics of data collection and analysis (Kobo toolbox, Google form, Microsoft Excel). By this initiatives units can regularly upload and updated information on life members, number of volunteers, and other unit activities to the Central Database.



Sex Worker's Health & Livelihood Support (SWHLD) project has been pre-evaluated:

The Bangladesh Red Crescent Society (BDRCS) launched a project titled Sex Worker's Health & Livelihood Support (SWHLD) in 2021 with financial support from The China Red Cross, which is being implemented by the Planning and Development Department, to improve the health and livelihood of sex workers in Rajbari's Daulatdia community. A pre-assessment was performed as part of the inception efforts to analyze the overall scenario and observe the vulnerability situation in this community.

The pre-assessment examines the general context of the most underprivileged parts of the community's situation of occupation, such as the type of the livelihood, the social environment, and the availability of health care services. After reviewing the overall scenario and observing the ground reality, it is expected that promoting awareness about health, cleanliness, and sanitation, as well as assessing the feasibility of alternative livelihoods for this community, could improve their quality of life.



German Red Cross supported SDSC Project:

Under the German Red Cross Supported Strengthening DRM Structures and Capacities of BDRCS (SDSC) project, various school-based activities related to disaster risk mitigation and first aid were held in Dhaka district, Chittagong district, Noakhali, Barguna, Netrokona and national headquarters in 2021. The Planning and Development Department is coordinating with the Society's Youth and Volunteers, DRM, Department of Human Resources and Administration and the German Red Cross to implement the activities.

ICRC Supported Organizational Development Project:

The ICRC OD Project supports a total of eight Red Crescent units, including Kishoreganj, Satkhira, Khagrachari, Bandarban, Chapai Nawabganj, Rangamati, and Cox's Bazar. The capacity of the units in Satkhira and Chapainawabganj was assessed by the initiative of this project. The project has achieved the following key achievements:

- 5,000 youth Red Crescent Youth volunteers of the Society are paid a global insurance premium for a period of six months.
- Under the duty of care, BDT 10,000 was paid to each of the 43 corona-affected Red Crescent youth volunteers who were on duty in COVID-19 response activities, and 13.5 lac taka was paid as risk allowance to the employees working across the country who performed their duties at risk during the pandemic situation.
- Apart from this, 3 lac taka has been provided from the project to Solidarity Fund formed to serve the Unit Executive Committee and Red Crescent Youth volunteers as they involved in the COVID-19 related activities through the risk
- A total of 90 people was trained in first aid and search and rescue in three batches in Sylhet, Kishoreganj, and Satkhira units with the participation of Red Crescent youth volunteers from the unit, and "First Aid, Search and Rescue Trainer Training" was held at the CCDB Hope Centre in Savar with the participation of 30 Youth Red Crescent volunteers from Rangamati, Khagrachari, and Cox's Bazar units.
- Oximeters were provided at all (56) of the countrywide maternity and child health (MCH) centers, as well as dopplers and nebulizers provided at 21 of MCH. In addition, COVID-19 response program of the society's provided oxygen services and cooked food, as well as ambulances, for three months in Satkhira and Champainawabganj.
- Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), as well as search and rescue equipment, has been handed to the Satkhira, Champainawabaganj, and Chittagong City Units to ensure first aid and emergency services during disasters. The project has granted salaries and allowances to the office assistants of Sylhet, Kishoreganj, Satkhira, and Champainawaganj units in 2021 in regard to demand.
- A total of BDT 1 crore has been allotted from the project for the construction of pre-fabricated buildings at the national headquarters.

Planning Monitoring Evaluation and Reporting

- In order to properly implement the Strategic Plan 2021-2025 of the Society, all activities have been performed to prepare the Annual Plan 2022 (Operational Plan 2022). Some improvements to the yearly plan template (result-oriented) have been made based on previous years' experience, and progress tracking techniques have already been developed to make the plan systematic and result-focused.
- Technical support is provided in the formulation of strategic plans for various PNS based on demand, so that the partners' country strategies are aligned with the Society's strategic plan.
- Post Distribution Monitoring (PDM) has been carried out in a systematic approach for the simulation of a heatwave under the Forecast Based Early Action (FbF) operation. A PDM report is prepared based on the field assessment, and the recommendations are communicated to management by this report.
- Technical support is provided to the project team in developing the project monitoring tool.
- A project evaluation, flood response activities, and cyclone response activities were done as part of the PMER section's regular activities. The evaluation results are already being shared at different levels.
- As in the previous year, weekly and tri-monthly reports released by highlight the overall status of COVID-19 operation of the BDRCS in terms of effective management. A three-monthly report on the departments' regular activities is also published. The English version of the Society's Annual Report 2020 has been made available. In addition, the Society's Annual Report 2021 was written and published after a process of planning, communication, data collecting, compilation, and refining.

Youth and Volunteers(Y&V) department

The BDRCS' Youth and Volunteer department, as a volunteer-based humanitarian organization, performs its activities through youth volunteers every year, in addition to the department's regular activities it has carried out several activities based on plan to combat the corona virus. Among the noteworthy programs are:



COVID-19 activities

For the prevention of COVID-19, simultaneous public awareness initiatives, mask distribution, immunization schedule, distribution of cooked food, distribution of oxygen, and ambulance services have been provided in all units of the country. About 4,200 active volunteers were involved in the program.

About 510 volunteers have provided assistance in vaccination programs and vaccination registration and crowd control in 20 centers of the capital and 45 wards of North City Corridor under the government's COVID-19 vaccination program.

Under the government's COVID-19 vaccination campaign, around 510 volunteers assisted with vaccination programs, vaccination registration, and crowd management in 20 centers of the capital and 45 wards of the North City Corporation.

A session on data control in the Data Online Security App was held for volunteers in order to register the residents of the Karail slum in the capital. Subsequently, the volunteers provided service to the slum people. This workshop drew 36 volunteers, 14 of whom were women and 22 of whom were men.

Support was provided to the National Head Quarters RCY volunteers in order to support COVID-19 patients by providing oxygen cylinders, controlling and preventing infection, risk communication/community engagement, and COVID-19 vaccination as part of the response to COVID-19 in unserved areas of Bangladesh.

BDT 10,000 was provided to COVID-19 affected RCY volunteers under duty of care. In addition, an excursion and team-building session were organized for the volunteers who participated in the COVID-19 vaccination campaign to help manage their stress.



Voluntary blood donation campaign



Non-remunerated blood donation campaigns were organized at different sites throughout the capital on different significant days. A workshop on blood donation was also held, with an award presented to the highest blood donor in order to encourage people to donate blood.



Disaster response

In four fire incidents, 94 RCY volunteers (56 females and 38 males) assisted the fire service force and civil defenses.



Provided first aid service

RCY volunteers provided service to the people on International Mother Language Day, the West Indies Tour of Bangladesh tournament, a picnic organized by Bandhu 85 Dhaka University, Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman's 100th birthday, the Ireland Tour of Bangladesh tournament, and the Bangabandhu 5th Central South Asian Artistic Gymnastic Championship.

Youth chief workshop:

Likewise, the past years, youth chief workshop was organized in 2021 where 80 RCY volunteers attended from 68 branches across the country. Out of 80 volunteers 08 were female and 72 were male. Through this workshop guideline was provided for developing plan for the following year. Simultaneously, guidelines were provided on how they will contribute to implement Youth and Volunteers department's plan.

Orientation/Training program

Orientation and training programs were organized in different time for volunteers to strengthen their skill so that they can serve the vulnerable people in need. Significant trainings are as follows

- Volunteers participated in a training on relief and humanitarian service organized by Disaster and Relief Ministry.
- RCRC basic and first aid training
- Volunteers participated on Urban Risk Assessment organized by British Red Cross.
- Workshop organized on COVID-19 vaccination for new RCY volunteers.
- Coping with stress workshop was organized for the RCY volunteers who were involved in vaccination campaign.
- First aid workshop organized for the cleaner of Dhaka North and South City Corporation.

National and International Day Observation

In 2021, 06 national and international days were observed, and significance of the days discussed during the event as well as discussed Red Crescent's roles and responsibilities.

- As a humanitarian organization, with the aim of raising revenue and making the Red Crescent known to all, the sale of gift items with monograms to local and international customers continued in 2021.
- As part of the fundraising activities, Rs. 3,015,000 (three lakh and fifteen thousand taka only) has already been collected from the Palmal Group and Individual levels for the vulnerable people in favor of the Society through the appropriate process.

Unit Affairs Department

- Annual General Meetings (AGM) and Unit elections are held in the scheduled units, and the department sends out circulars outlining the necessary preparations for the Annual General Meetings and election ceremonies.
- Overall cooperation was provided in the official work for the completion of OGM-2021 and BDRCS Managing Board Elections 2021-2023.
- After receiving information on the unit's AGM and election, documents are processed in order to form a committee.
- Regular cooperation with the unit, as well as assistance in overall administrative work and communication with the Unit Executive Committee on official matters.
- Update the information of the unit's delegates and assist in the formulation of the unit's different types of plans.
- Orientation was provided to 30 members of the executive committee of 10 units to increase the capacity of the unit.

Under 'Call for Proposal' project with the support of Swiss Red Cross

- Orientation is provided to the executive committee and life members of the unit following the Red Crescent Movement. The orientation was attended by a total of 30 members including 2 women and 26 men.
- Training and office room renovation of Bandarban, Chuadanga Sherpur unit
- In Rangpur, Chuadanga, and Sherpur units, LED display boards were installed with project and other important information.
- Eye camp was organized for eye treatment at Chuadanga unit. A total of 430 people were provided services through the camp, out of which 250 were women and 160 were men.
- Sub-district level Youth Red Crescent Volunteer team has been formed with 126 volunteers (40 women and 6 men).
- 4 blood grouping campaigns have been carried out in Bandarban, Rangpur, Chuadanga and Sherpur units.
- Dinner has been organized in 4 units for raising funds and preparation of fund-raising guide.
- Database development has been completed in Bandarban, Khagrachhari, Rangpur, Chuadanga and Sherpur units.
- Lesson Learn Workshop has been conducted with the accomplished activities of 5 units. The session was attended by 56 individuals (8 women and 50 men), including the chairman, secretary, ULO, youth chiefs, different directors of the national headquarters, and Swiss Red Cross representatives.

Legal Affairs Department

Legal opinions on different matters were provided to officials from the Bangladesh Red Crescent Society, Holy Family Red Crescent Medical College, and other related organizations, including employment legal action, applies for different cases, and responses to legal notices.

Furthermore, on behalf of the society the department conducts the necessary lobbying concerned with matters relating to the interest of the society in the Magistrate Court of the lower court, the Chief Judicial Magistrate Court, the Assistant Judge's Court, the Senior Assistant Judge's Court, the Joint and District Judge's Court and the High Court Division and the Appellate Division of the Bangladesh Supreme Court.

His Excellency the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court and the High Court Division have filed 12 different writ petitions, civil revision, administrative tribunal cases and civil, criminal, money litigation, tenant eviction, arbitration and arbitration lawsuits of the society pending in the lower court. Through continuous lobbying and administration, the committee has been working to resolve all problems, including those involving the court.

International Relation and Communication Department

International Relation

Relationship Development with Red Cross and Red Crescent Partners: In order to develop relations with different National Societies, IFRCs and ICRCs, the Department of International Relations collaborates with regular partners on its own initiative to conduct new official activities and coordinate meetings as well as ensure new cooperation. Among the notable works were



- The Bangladesh Red Crescent Society, with the financial support from the China Red Cross, handed over two million doses of Sinopharm vaccine to the Ministry of Health of the Government of Bangladesh.
- The International Relations Department played a vital role to ensure 50 oxygen concentrators and 14 million masks for BDRCS from the Singapore Red Cross.
- Initiatives were taken by the IR department to share the Society's COVID-19 vaccination experience and to learn from the other National Societies in South Asia, including Afghanistan, Bhutan, India, Pakistan, Nepal, Maldives, and Sri Lanka.
- For the first time in 2021, the Bangladesh Red Crescent Society provided a grant of BDT 10 lakh to the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC).
- Mr. Alexander Matthew, Asia and Pacific Director of the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies visited Bangladesh on 21-25 November 2021.

Partnership Development (with other organizations)

In addition to developing relations with different national societies, the society also submits direct applications for different projects of international and non-governmental organizations. The department has received BDT 1 crore 9 lakh from the Global Road Safety Partnership, BDT 4 crore 20 lakh from the Coca-Cola Foundation, and BDT 50 lakh from Facebook in this regard. BDT 5 crore 80 lakh in cash equivalent has been secured by the International Relation department in 2021 for different projects/programs.

Besides, other notable activities of the department are

- The Department of International Relations has confirmed a free ride or a discount of BDT 75 lakh in cash equivalent in partnership with the well-known international ride-sharing company Uber.
- The Bangladesh Red Crescent Society has been listed by the Department of International Relations as an Asian Development Bank and World Bank. In 2021, the Society has submitted a project proposal to the Asian Development Bank through a consortium shortlisted for the COVID-19 Technical Assistant Project.
- In collaboration with the Humanitarian Advisory Group (HAG), a reputed organization of Australia, the department supported Protection, Gender, and Inclusion (PGI) focal of the Society as well as supported for a Research in Asia and the Pacific on Diversity and Inclusion.
- The Department of International Relations is also working on the implementation of the Memorandum of Understanding with the Department of Health of the Government of Bangladesh and this Memorandum of Understanding is in the final stages of implementation.
- Coordinate with relevant departments, coordinate with partners and assist in implementation of response operations in COVID-19 response activities.
- Five doctors from Holy Family Red Crescent Medical College Hospital participated in an online training on 4th Training Program on Rational Use of Medicine at an international conference organized by Kunming Medical College Hospital, China.
- An official of the Society participated in the Asia Shelter Forum held on 25-26 November 2021 in Nepal.
- Provide assistance in partnership meetings with ICRC and BDRCS

Communication

The Society's Communication department works on a regular basis to provide much needed and timely information or awareness messages to the country's grassroots people in order to raise public awareness about natural and man-made disasters. In this context, the department carried out the following regular activities in 2021.

- Call in Live Radio Show Hello Red Crescent We are listening to you: since 2017, Thematic Call in Live Radio program has been broadcasting on community radio to provide urgent, necessary, and timely information to the people at grassroots. In
- About 70 call-in-live radio programs aired in the last five years. This year, two community radio stations - Radio Naf 99.2 FM and Radio Chilmari 99.2 - broadcasted 20 call-in-live radio shows featuring people from both sides of the country. Through 20 radio broadcasts, about 175,000 people received urgent and timely information about COVID-19, general health care, and other types of calamities.
- In 2021, the Society's Communication department successfully provided first aid training to approximately 70 media people working at different levels.

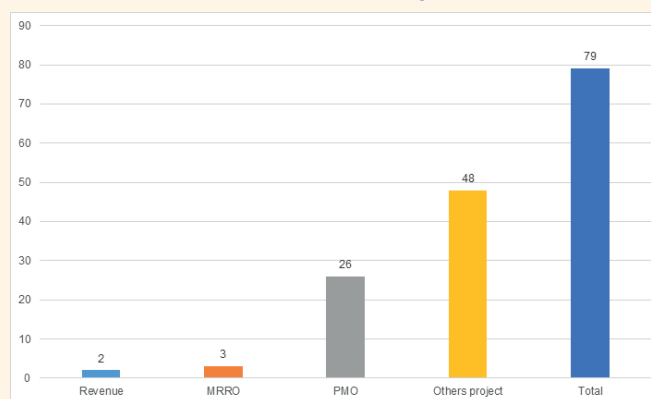

- Despite the disaster of COVID-19, the Human Resources Department of the Society has continued to recruit personnel for different projects. 79 people have been appointed until 2021.
- On the initiative of the Society's Human Resources department, arrangements have been made to provide BDRCS leadership training to a total of 32 officers in the first phase, in order to improve the skills of the society's officers.
- The process of updating and digitizing the personal documents of all the officers and employees of the Society is underway.
- In addition to financial assistance from the society's welfare fund, Metlife Insurance Company Limited has made necessary arrangements for insurance of all levels of employees as Group Medical Claim up to a maximum of BDT.200,000 for financial assistance for medical treatment and BDT 5,00,000 in case of death while on duty with the support of IFRC.
- A total of 4 posts of Deputy Director, Assistant Director, Junior Assistant Director, and Officer have been elevated to a total of 6 posts in three stages based on the current manpower structure of the society for the purpose of logical restructuring and promotion. 77 persons were promoted in total.

- The Society's Standing Order-2015 Review and Revision has kicked up the process of updating. In order to do this, the process of recruiting an External Consultant is underway.
- In the year 2021, the Staff Welfare Fund provided financial assistance to 6 individuals for the application of financial assistance for medical expenditures of officers and employees working in the society, as well as financial aid after the death of two employees while on the job.

Administration

Bangladesh Red Crescent Society has always conducted administrative and structural activities of the administration department in accordance with the Red Cross Red Crescent Movement's seven principles.

In relation to this, the department conducted and implemented different internal activities, observes national and international days, and engaged in additional activities such as the adoption of various action plans to protect the society's security.

The details of the regular activities of the department are given below

This year 4 meetings of the Board of Management were held under the chairmanship of Hon'ble Chairman of the Society Mr. Major General A.T.M Abdul Wahab (Ret.).

Extending the validity of regular and contractual officers and employees' ID cards at different times and providing new ID cards by preparing new ones in timely manners, issuing condolence messages, and extending the tenure of 10 Ansar's every six months.

Preparation of duty roster of security guards, provision of duty uniforms and necessary materials, formulation of policies regarding telephone, mobile and internet usage of officers / employees working in different departments / projects of the society.

Issuance of Robi SIM to the officers of the Society, issuance of necessary administrative office circulars / office orders and tender notices etc., checking of attendance books of all the officers of the Society daily, To exchange.

To keep the official activities in operation during the general holidays declared by the government, to monitor the work of the cleaners with emphasis on cleanliness, to distribute disinfectant hygienic kits (masks, hand sanitizers) among the officers and employees for the purpose of health protection and safety during office hours.



Immediate decision of the authorities to organize different meetings and milad mahfils, prepare diaries, calendars and greeting cards every year for Eid-ul-Fitr and Azha and to provide them to the officers and employees of the society on New Year.

Logistics

The logistics department has been providing all types of support / services to ensure the administration of ICT, warehousing, and vehicles, as well as proper procurement of goods and services in accordance with the demands of all Bangladesh Red Crescent Society departments.

The procurement activities of all departments are carried out by the Standing Procurement Committee and the Procurement Branch in accordance with the Standing Order.

Also computer, air conditioner, printing and stationery items for different departments, poster training module printing, annual minutes 2020, bag making, Society car repairs at different times, sale of antiques and prefabricated building at the national headquarters with the financial support of IFRC. Assistance has been provided in the implementation of the work.

Transport Section

In order to ensure the smooth implementation of the Transport Section of the Society's Logistics Department's overall activities, measures were made in 2021 to reduce the use, storage, and operation of the Society's vehicles to a minimum.

Efforts are being made to keep as many vehicles as possible with limited financial resources. The Society has been meeting the demand for vehicles as required in different activities and programs.

The use of vehicles is increasing day by day as the scope of administrative and other activities of the society has expanded. According to the 2021 census, the society has a total of 36 vehicles such as jeeps, cars, microbuses, ambulances, pick-ups / carry boy, minibuses and trucks (out of which 03 are jeeps and 2 are carry boy pickups).

There are plans to take different initiatives to keep the vehicles running by increasing the efficiency of the vehicle branch of the logistics department and to make it more dynamic by reducing fuel and maintenance costs as much as possible.

ICT Section

The ICT section was launched in 2011 to facilitate the information and technology work of the Bangladesh Red Crescent Society.

- The ICT branch is always working to keep the desk support, network, database, website, e-mail and internet connections of the officers / employees of the society active. In addition, ICT has provided with equipment purchase, ERP support, file archive etc. support.
- Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, many of the Society's official functions were digitized, with the majority of meetings held on Zoom and Microsoft Teams so that the ICT Section could provide all available support.
- Reorganize the BDRCS website, provide technical assistance in advanced information management information systems and databases, provide training in mobile based data collection and analysis, manage data management teams, contribute to data collection and analysis, use of information technology in international workshops and partners. Purchase of computer equipment is ensured as per service specifications and requisitions.
- The ICT section assists in overseeing the digital transformation process conducted by the Society's Planning and Development Department.



Finance Department

The Finance Department of the Bangladesh Red Crescent Society has been working relentlessly in order to improve the accounting and financial management system and to ensure greater accountability and transparency in all transactions. The Finance Department has also developed a plan for strengthening the accounting and financial management system of the Units of the Bangladesh Red Crescent Society. In the reporting year, with the funding and technical support from ICRC, Financial Development Training has been conducted in three districts of Chittagong Hill Tracts. In addition, for transparency and accountability of overall financial management system, initiatives have been taken to conduct Financial Monitoring of Units (Branches) and Projects, gradually bringing all the Units under financial Accounting Software, and incorporating Unit Financial Report into the National Headquarters' financial reports. According to the recommendation of the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC) for improving and transforming the existing Financial Management system of the Society, the initial activity of "Working with Program Partners (WWPP)" has been completed, finalization of which is underway.

In the reporting year, out of total received taka 156 Crore 07 Lakh 51 thousand and 954 (Tk 1,560,751,954), taka 29 crore 89 lakh 69 thousand 87 were received under Myanmar Refugee Relief Operation (UNHCR), taka 58 Crore 43 lakh 77 thousand 954 (Tk 584,377,954) were received under Population Movement Operation, and taka 16 Crore 45 lakh 09 thousand 981 (tk 164,509,981) were received under countrywide COVID-19 vaccination program. With the Taka 4 Crore allocation of the Government of Bangladesh for the construction of 7th Story to 12th Story of the Academic Building of Holly Family Red Crescent Medical College, the total allocation has reached taka 15 crores. The Pre-Fabricated Building Construction is underway in the National Headquarters with the estimated cost of taka 5 Crores, which has been incurring from the joint fund of IFRC, ICRC and PNSS.

Internal Audit Department

In the reporting year, alongside performing routine roles and responsibilities, the Internal Audit Department had audited bills and vouchers under Population Movement Operation (PMO) and various other projects implemented with funding support from Partner National Societies (PNSs), and provided feedback and recommendations in accordance with Society's Standing Orders and other (Government) rules and regulations. In 2021, the Department provided feedback, and suggestions according to standard rules of business to Finance/ relevant departments in order to settle the bills and vouchers. Alongside of this, the Department also provided the necessary information and regular monitoring report for mobilize the Logistics Department of the Society. Below are the highlights of the activities of the Department in 2021:

- The bills and vouchers for all Cash Distribution of the Society had been audited
- The bills and vouchers for all programs implemented with the funding support of IFRC had been audited.
- The bills and vouchers for all programs implemented with the funding support of ICRC had been audited. In addition, bills and vouchers of all programs implemented with support from PNSs had also been audited.
- Routine and regular auditing of bills and vouchers of all Departments. Especially, the process of the Logistics Department had been closely monitored and audited and necessary feedback and recommendations were provided for modernization/ revitalization of the Department.

Estate Department

The collection of rent from various buildings and establishments of the Society is the only source of revenue income. All the activities and functions of the Society are operated through the revenue income. The revenue income is increasing every year due to the renewal of the tenant agreements, the positive result of which the Society is enjoying. A brief update of current condition, progress, and future plan of the buildings and establishments managed by the Real Estate Department is given below:

For the relocation of the Base Depot, a two-story office building and a warehouse of 15,180 Square feet has been constructed by the Chattogram Unnayan Kotripakkho which is located at the River Bank of Laldiar Char, behind the Incontrade under Bandar Thana of Potenga in Chattogram. Currently, the land and the warehouse (without the office building) has been rented out to a Chattogram based local institute. A tenant agreement has been done with the said institute with monthly rent of BDT 15 lakh, which will be in effect upon completion of the construction activity by the Chattogram Unnayan Kotripakkho.

Community Empowerment Program (CEP)

The revenue earned from the leased assets under Community Empowerment Program (CEP) has been deposited into Society's fund. In the following fiscal year of 2021-2022, the Society might make a profit of about taka 10,00,000 (taka Ten Lakh) from the leased ponds at the end of the lease tenure.

Protection, Gender, Inclusion (PGI) and Child Protection

- With the support of the Norwegian Red Cross, 800 copies of “field protection guidelines” have been printed for the staff, volunteers, and officials in order to operate field-level activities. 8,000 copies of brochures have been printed about “Sexual Violence, Child Protection, Child Marriage. During the COVID-19 pandemic situation, 3000 posters about the “problems of negative thinking and decision making” and 3000 brochures about “information on PGI” were printed which were distributed to all Departments of National Headquarters, 68 Units, PMO, MRRO, and Bhashan Char. In addition, 600 copies of the Child Protection Policy in Bangla and 3000 leaflets about information on the rights and entitlements of persons with disability, and elderly persons.
- A consultant was hired in order to revise and update the Gender Policy and Guideline of the BDRCS. A workshop was organized to finalize the Gender Policy.
- The Gender Policy of BDRCS was reviewed and updated which is under approval process by the Managing Board of the Society. Besides, the PSEA (Prevention and Response to Sexual Exploitation and Abuse) policy was approved by the Managing Board and printing of the Policy was completed.
- A 14-member Gender Working Committee has been formed comprising officials/ focal points of BDRCS and IFRC.
- A study report about Diversity and Inclusion in the Society was prepared by the Humanitarian Advisory Group.
- PGI Orientation was provided in the NDRT training organized by the Society. The RCY volunteers and UDRT members of Tangail and Sirajgonj Unit under the 2019 Flood Response Program, and RCY volunteers of Jamalpur Unit were also oriented on PGI. As a part of the International Women Day 2021 program, PGI orientation was organized for the RCY volunteers of the Society.
- 50 pcs of Hygiene and Dignity kits were distributed among the Slum-dwellers as a part of the International Women Day 2021 program.
- Conducted Live show on the Social Media about Psychosocial Support during COVID-19 pandemic and disseminated Video documentary to create awareness against child abuse.

Safer Access

- A workshop was organized to develop safer access training manual, identify gaps and errors in the manual and make corrections of those, and assess the appropriateness of the manual for use at the field level.
- Re-printing of 12000 copies both safety security policy and safety security guideline was completed (Pocket size 2000 and regular size 10000 copies)
- For proper knowledge management, 12 Units of the Society were provided with a laptop, a projector, and a sound system.
- 4 Video Messages have been developed, for the RCY volunteers deployed in the COVID-19 vaccination program, to support them in managing any adverse situation in the vaccination centers. In order to the training of the RCY volunteers, the videos have been disseminated in all 68 units of the Society through Youth and Volunteers Department.
- A round table meeting was conducted to discuss on Safer Access with the participation of Leaders of the Cox’s Bazar District.
- Considering the COVID-19 situation, a 3-hour online training manual about Safer Access has been prepared.
- Sessions were conducted about Safer Access for 60 participants in two batches of the NDRT training organized by the Disaster Response Department, and among 69 Youth Chiefs during the Youth Chief Conference.

Community Engagement and Accountability (CEA)

In line with the ongoing commitment and trend of the Red Cross Red Crescent Movement and various international humanitarian agencies, the Society emphasizes ensuring the participation of and accountability to all relevant stakeholders while providing various services and implementing programs. As a part of this, the Society's initiative toward community engagement and accountability (CEA) is acknowledged as an effective initiative. The main objective of the CEA activity is to create mutual trust and credibility through establishing partnerships between crisis-affected people and organizations. CEA is playing important role in ensuring active participation and engagement of all involved parties toward the improvement of living conditions and bringing positive changes. The implementation of programs on the basis of assessment of needs and damages of the community and providing necessary information about project designing, selection of area and beneficiaries, monitoring and evaluation process, etc. are ensured as a part of CEA. BDRCS officials, ICRC, IFRC, movement partners, stakeholder organization, unit executive committee members, life members, project stakeholders, and other delegates have all played a supportive role in ensuring community participation and accountability activities in integrated management in accordance with BDRCS CEA policies / guidelines.

Significant CEA activities in 2021 include:

- Approval of CEA Policy, Guideline and Training Module and mainstreaming of CEA into programs.
- A total of 34 batches of CEA training, orientation, workshops, and awareness meetings are delivered online and by direct participation in different location such as National Headquarters, Units, Communities, PMOs, and MRRO. 

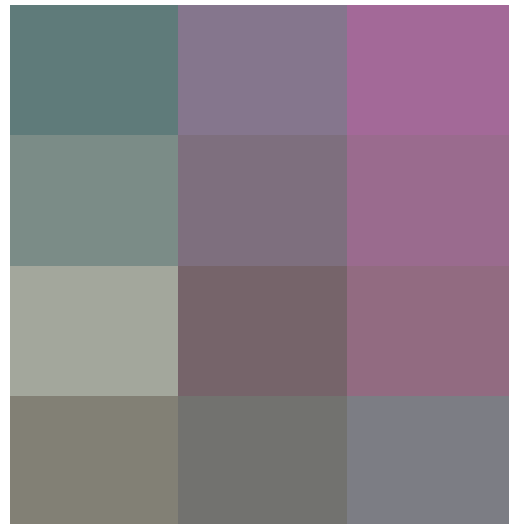

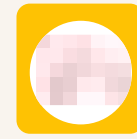
