

Situation Report-1, Fire Incidents (Multiple Locations) | Date: 30 March 2026 | Time: 04:00 PM

Overall Situation:

In March 2026, multiple devastating fire incidents were reported across Khagrachari, Sunamganj, and Narail districts. These fires, predominantly occurring in commercial hubs and residential clusters, have resulted in massive economic losses and the displacement of families. While no fatalities have been reported, the destruction of shops and household assets has left many without a means of livelihood or basic shelter.

District wise situation Updates:

Khagrachari (Dighinala Upazila) A massive fire broke out at Boalkhali Bazar around 3:00 AM on March 26, 2026. The blaze, which started in a single shop, quickly engulfed the market, destroying at least 35 shops. Bangladesh Army from the Dighinala Zone, along with local residents, supported the Fire Service in a multi-hour operation. The Market Management Committee estimates losses between 4–5 Crore BDT, as shopkeepers were unable to rescue any inventory due to the late-night timing.



Sunamganj (Sadar/Traffic Point) On the night of March 29, 2026 a major fire erupted at the central Traffic Point of Sunamganj around 11:00 PM. 15 shops were completely incinerated before the blaze was contained. The fire service worked alongside law enforcement and local volunteers to prevent the fire from spreading to the heart of the town's commercial district. A short circuit is the suspected cause.



Narail (Lohagara Upazila) On March 13, 2026 a tragic fire struck the Boira area of Lakhipasa Union, affecting 2 large families consisting of 22 members. The families lost all their worldly possessions, including granaries, clothing, and household documents. They are currently in a dire state, struggling to secure basic food and clothing after their homes were reduced to ashes.



BDRCS Actions:

- **Emergency First Aid:** BDRCS Sunamganj Unit volunteers were immediately deployed to the Traffic Point fire to provide first aid to the injured and assist in crowd management during the firefighting operations.
